Pastor's Page

Happy New Year!

No, I this isn't a mixup. This isn't my January newsletter article. I really do mean to tell you "Happy New Year" at the beginning of November.

And, no, it's not because the new Church Year starts November 28th with the first Sunday in Advent. That is happening, but that's not why I'm saying "Happy New Year."

I'm saying "Happy New Year" now because I want your new year to be happy when it starts. I want you to be able to put the old behind you and move forward with new goals and plans.

Think about previous new years. On Dec. 31 you decide that there are certain things you're going to do every day in the new year (exercise, eat right, show your love to your spouse, hug your child, etc.), and there are certain things you will not do at all (lose your temper, eat greasy food, miss church, watch mindless TV, etc.). You make a New Year's Resolution. And then, shortly into the new year, you break it, and give up.

Why does that happen? Well, maybe, just maybe, it's because you failed to prepare. I'll use a simple example to explain. Let's say I decide that in the

new year I won't eat any Peanut M&Ms. However, since I'm known to love them, seven different people gave me Peanut M&Ms for Christmas. Now what do I do? Most likely I decide to give them away, but then I think I'll hurt the feelings of the folks who gave them to me, and besides, I really love them, so . . . You know what happens by Epiphany!

Instead, if I began my preparation Nov. 1, I could let all the people around me know that I won't be eating Peanut M&Ms in 2011, so they won't pick that for a Christmas present, and I at least stand a chance of keeping my resolution (provided I don't break down at Easter!) OK, it's a silly example, but just think about something you've been saying you want to do, and how many ways that temptation gets right back inside you and trips you up. Is it possible you could head that off with careful planning and preparation? What would it take *today* to make possible *two months from now* the goal you have in mind?

Maybe it's not a silly goal. Maybe it has to do with getting yourself ready for retirement. Maybe it's getting your will written (don't forget Trinity when you do!), or starting back to school, or having that difficult talk with your aging parents, or your teenage daughter.

Maybe it's the first step toward a career change. Chances are good that if you want to do something important, there will be lead time, maybe lots of lead time. When God sent his Son into the world he prepared for hundreds, no, for thousands of years! Jesus spent about 30 years getting ready for 3 years of intense ministry on earth.

When I was the Director of Admissions and Recruitment at Concordia Seminary I spent much of my time with men and their families who were preparing to make a major change. Some were planning years ahead, some only months, but all had many tasks to complete before they could actually enroll and make the move. And, frankly, some weren't very good at it! Some procrastinated, some didn't pay

attention to communications, and some even failed to make it to Seminary because of it.

Everyone has different levels of preparation skills. I'm married to a preparer par excellence, while I'm good at some preparing and not others. But I've had this article in mind for a couple of weeks now, and I suspect it may be because someone out there needs to be thinking, "It'll be 2011 in two months! I've got to get cracking!"

At the end of this month we'll enter the Church's season of preparation, Advent, and begin to prepare our hearts for the Christ to come in again. May the God who has centuries of experience in preparation prepare your heart to meet him!

The Gift Gets Bigger

Trinity's third year in producing *The Gift* for our downtown neighbors to open the Christmas season at Lake Eola will be our most elaborate community stage show and festival yet.

The Festival opens at 4:00pm with original "Orlando Christmas BBQ" and other sidewalk staples plus unique Christmas gift shops and several atmosphere entertainment groups all around the Disney Amphitheater at Lake Eola. *The Gift* builds on a decade-old tradition of Trinity celebrating Christmas with its friends and neighbors in the park.

At 6:00pm our Trinity Lutheran School children will present their annual Christmas play on the Lake Eola stage as their special gift to the neighborhood.

And an hour later, we will light a 35-foot, live spruce Christmas tree on the lake shore with a special ceremony featuring Voice of Liberty

vocalist Debbie Johnson. It will remain lighted, in place, until early January.

Then at 7:00pm, the grand, live musical stage show will begin with Pastor Moore reading the Christmas story to a group of children. A massed choir of more than 100 Greater Orlando church choir singers will perform Christmas choral arrangements by popular arranger and conductor, Derric Johnson, Conductor Emeritus of the familiar Epcot *Candlelight Procession*.

In addition, the program will feature soloists, heralding trumpets, The Trinity Jazz Ensemble and the dramatic reading *One Solitary Life*.

Parking in the "Trinity" parking garage is free and the school gym will be the rain backup just in case. The Gift is produced by Trinity Downtown Productions, Ron Logan and Wren Aber, producers.

A Servant's Heart

One day last week, the following quotations from a two different sources appeared in my mail: 1) "I can't wait" "I am determined"...."I am unwilling"..."I've got it figured out"

2) "If you don't have what you need to accomplish your dream, you may have the wrong dream – or the wrong plan!".... "Are you limiting God by thinking all the answers must come through you?"

One view looks to self for answers. The other view looks to God for guidance. Believe it or not, that same day, my daily devotion addressed these different views. Here is a paraphrased synopsis of 2 Kings 4: 1-7: A woman was in financial ruin due to her husband's death. All the solutions she tried on her own had failed and she was 'at the end of her rope' and 'couldn't take any more'. Then she went to the church for help. When she gave up on her self-centered direction and looked to the Lord for her answer,

a seemingly ridiculous order solved her problem. The action God commanded seems unrelated to her problem, yet through her obedience the relevance is revealed. Imagine the joy in seeing what you thought was the last drop (or dollar) turn into abundance!

Our society promotes self-motivation and self-preservation, but our Christ centered-faith directs us away from self. Our major pursuit in life needs to be our relationship with the Lord. When our priority is first the Lord's business, our busyness will truly bear abundant fruit. The response that God wants from us is our longing for Him. Psalm 63 offers both empathy and encouragement as each of us individually (and corporately) deal with problems: "...my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water...My soul will be satisfied as with fat and rich food...for you have been my help, and in the shadow of your wings I will sing for joy...your right hand upholds me."

The Gift Includes Lake Eola Park Christmas Tree Lighting This Year



The Gift Christmas musical stage production and festival returns to the Lake Eola amphitheater Friday, December 3, 2010, 4:00 to 9:30pm, and it promises to be even bigger and better than ever. *The Gift* is based on an Orlando Christmas tradition that goes back more than a decade.

This year's special "gift" will include the lighting of Orlando's Lake Eola Park tree, as a gift to its Orlando neighbors from Trinity Downtown Lutheran Church and its production partners. And the stage entertainment is also a "free gift" to all who appreciate special Christmas music and enjoy the goodwill of this special season in downtown Orlando.

The 35-foot, all-natural spruce tree will be officially lighted at 7:00 pm and will signal the arrival of the official Christmas holiday season in the City Beautiful.

The tree-lighting ceremony will feature *Voices of Liberty* vocalist Debbie Johnson.

The Gift stage production will begin with a combined choir from the greater Orlando area featuring Christmas choral arrangements by popular arranger and conductor, Deric Johnson, who is Conductor Emeritus of the familiar Epcot *Candlelight Procession*. Children will gather to hear Trinity pastor Jeff Moore read the true Christmas Story from St. Luke.

In addition, the program will include soloists, heralding trumpets, The Trinity Jazz Ensemble and the dramatic reading *One Solitary Life*. Last year's *The Gift* featured more than one hundred

voices from greater Orlando area churches.

The Gift marks the opening of the Lake Eola Park holiday season and features several different types of entertainment for all ages, beginning at 4:00 pm:

- 4:00 pm, *The Gift Christmas Festival* (food, unique gift concessions and atmosphere entertainment)
- 6:00 pm, *Traditional School Christmas Play* (Trinity Lutheran School children)
- 7:00 pm, *Orlando Lake Eola Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony*
- 7:30 pm, *The Gift* (musical production with massed choir, orchestra and fanfare trumpets)

The Gift Christmas Festival will include "Orlando Christmas BBQ" and other featured menu dinner items as well as snacks and drinks throughout the evening. It also will have unique gift concessions to help audience members begin their annual shopping. Atmosphere entertainment will continue throughout the event.

Proceeds from a free-will offering will benefit Project IDignity, a downtown ministry that helps provide proper identification for homeless residents.

The 2009 edition of *The Gift* had to move indoors to Trinity's School gym, 123 East Livingston St. (3 blocks from Lake Eola) because of an unusually lengthy rain storm (for that time of year). This year, that will be the backup plan in the unlikely event that rain should visit us again. Either way, parking in the garage across the street from Trinity is free to audience and performers for *The Gift* beginning at 5pm.

The Gift is produced by Trinity Downtown Productions, Ron Logan and Wren Aber, Producers. *The Gift* production partners include: Trinity Downtown Lutheran Church, The City of Orlando, Bethany Christian Services, Printing USA and Thrivent Financial Services.

Thanksgiving Bread

Trinity has a tradition of blessing and sharing loaves of bread on Thanksgiving. Usually a Trinity family volunteers to come into the church kitchen on Thanksgiving Eve and spend the morning baking bread. The loaves are then wrapped and placed on the altar for a blessing during worship on Thanksgiving Eve and Day. We need someone to bake and wrap on Thanksgiving Eve day, and someone to drive the remaining loaves to a local shelter after worship Thanksgiving Day.
