Pastor's Page

Just Live!

OK, help me out, I can't be sure, but I think the movie is "Ever After." The Brothers Grimm are interviewing Cinderella's descendant, a very old lady who actually still has the glass slipper. At the very end there's some conversation about whether Cinderella and the prince lived "happily ever after," and the answer, I think, is, "no, but the important thing is, they lived!"

The older I get, the more I realize that I can't wait for life to "get back to normal" before I move out of emergency mode. I can't expect that there will come a day when "all the ducks are in a row." Things aren't going to "settle down." Our experience with Billy's ordination has been a great example—every time we think we've got it figured out, that there's a certain date when it'll all be taken care of, another monkey wrench gets thrown into the works, and there's more waiting. As I'm writing this right now I don't know whether, by the time you read this, we'll have a certain ordination date or not.

Of course, I want to say, "once Billy's ordained, he can do X, Y, and Z, and I can relax a little." But then, most of my life there has been some X, Y, and Z coming between me and a more relaxed life! I look across the street at my

neighbor's house and think, "one day, when things are calmer, I'll be able to just stop by while Holly is out there playing with little Jack and just have some fun with them, just be a good neighbor." Well, Holly was pregnant with little Jack when we moved in almost 8 years ago, and I've stopped by for more than a few seconds only a handful of times. Now Holly and Greg have moved with not-so-little Jack to Sarasota, and there's a new, younger little Jack across the street (really!), along with his sister, mom and dad. Will I do any better this time? Or will my new neighbors slowly realize that I'm never home, and never have time to just be a neighbor?

So Lisa and I are determined to simplify everyday life now, not later. The details are uncertain as I write, but we are just unwilling to spend the last 10 or 15 of our most productive years always panting and exhausted, with nothing left over for just plain living.

Maybe we're the only ones, but when I talk to some of you I hear things that tell me you might identify with what I'm saying here!

Have you ever tried to visualize the broad scope of the Bible? There are lots of dramatic events recorded, but there

are hundreds of years in which people just lived! They grew up, married, had children, worked, played, worshiped, all the things you and I are supposed to do. They didn't do anything that God chose to record in the Bible, but their lives mattered, too. Jesus genealogy includes many names that occur only in the list, with no additional information given. They "just" lived—but they passed down their faith to their children until finally Mary and Joseph grew up in fine God-fearing homes.

This isn't the first time I've mentioned this theme to you, but it seems very appropriate to me right now. What are you doing to live a life that someone else would want to imitate? What do your neighbors think of you? Do they want what you have?

If not, maybe there are some major restructurings called for. Maybe you can't just keep up business as usual, with just a few things

tuned up. Maybe it will take serious change before you can relax, chat with your neighbors, enjoy the beauty of God's creation, and make a positive impact for Christ.

Even the three years of Jesus' ministry include only a month or two of actual stories. While there was a lot of drama in Jesus life, there were a lot of ordinary days, too, when his disciples got to know him, when they learned what it meant that he loved them. Jesus didn't try to accomplish a million things per day, but did a few things extremely well (OK, perfectly!).

As we come up on the fall season, with so many activities planned for the comfortable weather, with the holidays fast approaching, may God grant you rest and leisure to enjoy just living!

"Moving toward unity." It's an idea worth exploring.

Like you, I've spent countless hours in Trinity meetings earnestly debating the priorities our congregation should follow in order to fulfill its mission to spread the Gospel.

"We need to close the 'back door,'" some rightfully point out. (Meaning keep members we currently have.) Others say, "We need to do a better evangelism job." (Reaching new souls.) 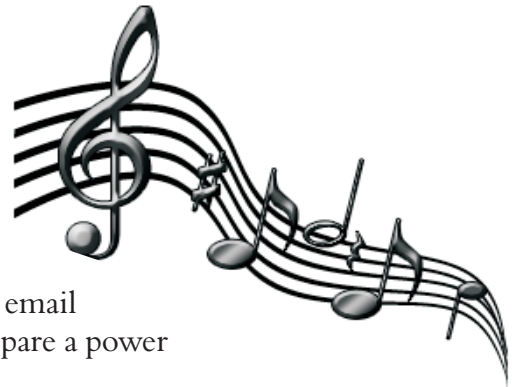

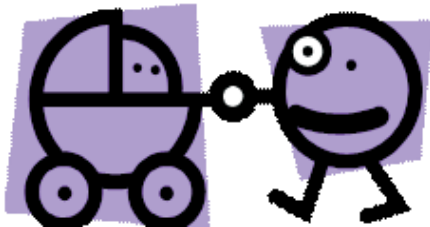
Happy 50th anniversary to the 50 stars on our American Flag!

ORLANDO UNION RESCUE MISSION WEDNESDAY EVENING MEAL DISTRIBUTION

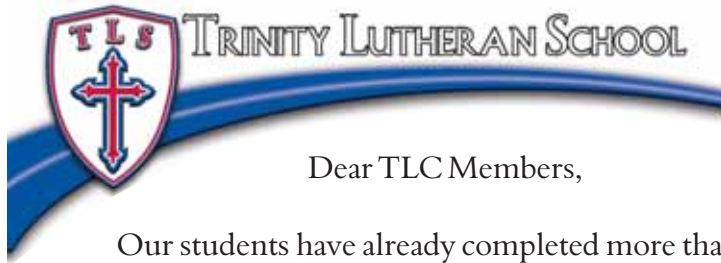
A reminder: Volunteers are still needed to assist with bringing meals and drinks to tables, share God's Love with a smile and conversation over dinner the first and third Wednesdays of the month at the Orlando Union Rescue Mission Women's and Children's Center. The center is located at 1525 W. Washington. Volunteers are asked to arrive by 4:30 pm. Evening meal activities conclude by 6. Our goal is to form a minimum of 3-4 teams each made up of 3-4 people. This scheduling structure would mean volunteers would need to serve once every six to eight weeks. Can't come to the Women and Children's Center on the first or third Wednesday? You can still help by dropping off a dessert at church that can be served with dinner.

DID YOU KNOW?? Trinity is still an active partner with other downtown churches in Project IDignity? This ministry helps homeless men and women obtain Identification and Social Security cards. Why is this important? If you don't have some sort of identification card, you can't get into a homeless shelter, apply for a job, qualify for food stamps, unemployment or veterans benefits. You can't open a bank account or rent an apartment.

A Servant's Heart

As I reviewed my past articles, it seemed I have slipped into "law" mode, and I apologize for pointing out flaws and weaknesses. So, this month, I intend on sharing the joy and wonder of God's awesome power. Although I believe and expect God is all-powerful, I am amazed and awed when I see God at work and hear how He undeniably acted in someone's life. Permit me to share how He takes a group of unrelated, unique individuals and uses them to accomplish His purpose in the Orlando downtown community.

Last month, I mentioned the upcoming (and now past) IDignity Souper Douper fundraiser. If you missed that article, or don't remember, here is a brief refresher: The Board of Directors of IDignity planned a simple soup and bread fundraiser. The Board members each invited guests to share their table and enjoy homemade soup they provided. The free invitation came with only one string attached: bring your checkbook! The point of the dinner was two-fold. First, to bring IDignity's purpose and monthly events to the attention of more people associated with Orlando's downtown churches and other organizations in the community, and second, to raise enough funds to offset the

increasing cost of providing free identification cards and other vital documents. The soup supper was a success in both areas. As of this newsletter deadline, \$40,000 was donated and pledged. What a blessing! We thank God for providing free event space at the Orlando Rescue Mission and for the hundreds of volunteers who give their time each month, but every monthly IDignity event requires approximately \$5000 to cover the expenses. Our key note address that evening was based on Matthew 25: 31-46, and why we should "Pay Attention". Pay attention to successes rather than failures. Pay attention to what is happening rather than what might happen. Pay attention to the stranger, the sick, the imprisoned. Pay attention to hear the sound of God's whisper in your ear.

Whether serving the community through organized events such as IDignity, serving with your family here at Trinity, or serving your household of immediate relatives, you will find God at work through you. Let Him use you. Pay attention to the opportunities He places before you, for we are created for His purposes.

Did the title catch your attention? After you read those chapters in which God details the ways to clean and prepare your body, you will really appreciate the following suggestions for eating a healthy meal.

According to information found at WomenFitness.net and FitnessMagazine.com, our living is enhanced by the color of foods on our plate. Fruits and vegetables are color splashes that reduce your risk of stroke and high blood pressure. They lower your risk of heart disease, skin, lung, breast, stomach, and colon cancer. Fruits and vegetables boost your immune system and help manage and lose weight. GREEN okra, avocados kiwi and grapes; ORANGE apricots, mangoes, butternut squash; YELLOW pineapple, lemons, corn; RED kidney beans, watermelon, pomegranate, cherries; BLUE/PURPLE eggplant, figs, blueberries, grapes; WHITE onions, pears, bananas, cauliflower.

WAYS TO ADD COLOR TO YOUR PLATE

- Eat a chocolate-covered strawberry instead of a candy bar.
 - Add fresh or frozen vegetables to pasta sauces.
 - Add fresh fruit to your cereal.
- Top sandwiches with tomatoes and fresh peppers.
- Make a smoothie for breakfast (juice, yogurt, and fruit).
 - Drink juice instead of soda.

(Mix your favorite 100% fruit juice with club soda if you miss the fizz!)

- Add chopped broccoli or grated zucchini to your omelet.
- Mix chopped spinach, kale, or other greens into spaghetti sauce.

Fighting Breast Cancer

It's very likely that you know someone who has cancer. We are all touched by this disease in one way or another, and know what a difficult journey it is for those who are fighting it. Below is part of an email sent by an amazing woman in our school family who has just been diagnosed with breast cancer. As she finds out more about her condition and the treatment she faces in the days and months ahead, she sends out an update to let us know what's going on. Her recent update was remarkable. It was a short letter to friends and family, what she calls her "love list," and it was about what she has experienced in the past few days. She speaks of her growing "Attitude of Gratitude," a need for waterproof mascara (to avoid looking like a raccoon when crying), and a lesson shared with her by a breast cancer survivor: Expect Miracles. She says, once you start looking, they're everywhere... In just a couple of days, her miracles are:

Miracle: There are total strangers who care. Strangers, who in the blink of the eye, become loved and trusted friends.

Miracle: The people who work with those who are undergoing life-threatening stuff like this, are there for a reason. They are gifted by God. Sometimes the gift is compassion, sometimes firm boundaries, sometimes the gift is the ability to look the look the other way, or give a deranged-raccoon-looking woman an encouraging glance.

Biggest Miracle Yet: That there are people placed alongside the road who will help. Ann Peach. I want to meet this woman and throw my arms around her, and thank her. I still am in shock/awe that she is making this all possible.

Miracle: A total stranger who's a breast cancer survivor coming to my doctor's appointment today, showing me her reconstructed breasts, and letting me touch one. Please don't get freaked out people. This was an AMAZING act of kindness. To have body parts removed, and then to hear that you can have new ones put in... well that all sounds well and good. But you don't really know unless you see for yourself. I have SO much respect for this woman, because it gave me some real perspective on what I want to do.

She closes with a huge list of Thank You's; for cards, scripture, offers to keep the kids, planning for meals, prayers, love, having other survivors call, and more. She's hoping to "go under the knife" in the next 3 weeks—and she's prepared to glorify God in each and every step!

You may not be fighting cancer, it may be unemployment you're facing, the death of a loved one, a divorce, or some other challenge in your life—but we can learn from a breast cancer survivor, to Expect Miracles (and then share them).

Uncle Kenny's Barbecue wins Grand Champion prize at Downtown BBQ Cook-off

Maintaining his title for another year, Kenny Nadeau of Uncle Kenny's Barbecue in Winter Garden took home top honors in the Pulled Pork and People's Choice categories and a 2nd place for Chicken, along with the Grand Champion's trophy and \$1,900 prize money from the 2nd annual Downtown BBQ Cook-off and Family Festival Aug. 28. The cook-off was sponsored by Trinity Downtown at 123 E. Livingston St. in Orlando, across from the Orange County Courthouse.

Sixteen teams started off with 40 pounds of Boston butt pork and chicken thighs to come up with a unique and tasty sauce, rub or roasting technique to win the judges and attendees votes.
