Pastor's Page

What's the opportunity here?

"Pastor, I can't afford to tithe anymore."

"Why not?"

"Well, years ago, when I only made \$100 per week, my tithe (ten percent), was only \$10. That's not very much. But now I make several thousand dollars every week, so the tithe is several hundred dollars. I can't give that much!"

"I'm glad you came to me. Let's pray together now that God will reduce your income so you can afford to tithe!"

That's an old, old, joke, but maybe it's appropriate today. I'm going to say this tongue in cheek, so please don't take me too seriously, but perhaps God is fed up with the percentage he's been receiving from us, and has decided to reduce our income so that our offerings become true tithes! The average American church member gives about 2 ½ % of his income to church, or one-fourth of a tithe. So maybe if God cuts three-quarters from his income, his offering will become a tithe!

Seriously, what's the opportunity in

this financial mess in our country? I believe that one opportunity is to rethink our spending and get our priorities in line. If you've been a tither in the past, and your income has dropped, it might be appropriate for your offering to drop too. However, since our Finance Committee has suggested that 5 or 10 extra dollars from each of us per week would get us out of the red, I've decided to give that extra money even though Trinity has shifted some health care costs to all our full-time workers to cut costs. I hope that other tithers will make the same decision.

On the other hand, if you've been more like the average American, giving a quarter-tithe or so, I'd like to encourage you, even if your income has suffered, to consider raising, rather than lowering, your offerings. That would mean that, instead of balancing your budget by cutting your church offerings, you might cut some dining out, or get rid of some premium cable channels, or—well, you get the idea.

One excellent way to increase your offerings would be to set up an automatic debit plan, so that even on the Sundays you can't get to church, or when you forget your checkbook, your offering still gets here. I've

looked at the giving patterns of the congregation, and if everyone gave every week, instead of just when they get to church, we wouldn't have a financial crisis here. Very few of our members take advantage of the automatic debit option—I'm asking you to consider it. If you'd call Connie in the church office she could suggest several ways that can be set up, all of them secure.

You know, I'd much rather be writing to you about Easter! But from time to time our church family needs a little straight talk about money, so that's my topic this month. Please prayerfully consider what I've written. In order to carry on the ministry that has been handed down to us at Trinity we need to raise about \$3,000,000 per year. \$2 million of that is in the form of tuition and fees for our school and CDC, but the other million comes from our voluntary donations. If those donations aren't there, we won't stop proclaiming the Gospel—we'll just have to find a way to do so without our school, CDC, and/ or our buildings. Can the Good News of Jesus be shared without those resources? Yes. Do you believe God wants us to do it that way? I don't!

Jesus didn't own a thing, humanly speaking, but he used the Temple, his parents home,

even a manger, that had been passed down to him by previous generations. That's what we have here at Trinity, the same kind of resources that Jesus inherited. I believe we should use them well!

As we celebrate our 90th anniversary, we're not celebrating the buildings, but rather the things that happen in the buildings. Here's the schedule:

April 26th we'll celebrate all the confirmations since 1919. If you were confirmed here, please join us in any of the services. We'll also confirm 14 young people at 11:00.

May 17th we'll celebrate all weddings. If you were married at Trinity, please join us!

Thursday, May 21st, at Ascension, we'll celebrate the Music Ministry of Trinity at 7 pm.

May 31st (Pentecost) we'll celebrate baptisms (well over 2,000 of them since 1919). Join us if you were baptized at Trinity.

June 7th (which is Trinity Sunday) we'll have a grand celebration of all Trinity's ministry, with Pastor Emeritus Ronald Fink preaching. I hope everyone who loves Trinity will join us that day.

Contact me (Vicar Andy) with a group that you would like to lead. 4. Pray for this process and that through it people in our congregation can grow closer together and closer to our Lord

and that people in our community would come to know and trust Jesus as their savior.

What interest groups are not:

1. Interest groups are not Bible Study and do not replace Bible study. In addition to these groups we need to be in regular bible study both individually and corporately.

2. Interest groups are not the solution to every difficulty that churches have. They are however a way for us to connect and share our faith with each other and those in our community. They also are a great way for us to have fun with each other.

3. Interest groups are not a program that does the work for us. Interest groups are a tool for us to use to help us develop relationships inside and outside the church. Through these relationships we encourage each other and share our faith with others.

Please be part of these interest groups. Consider leading one. Pray for this tool that we may use it to reach out to others.

Most history fans of Sir Winston Churchill regularly refer to his famous post-Battle of Britain radio speech in which he lifted the spirits of his beleaguered island nation to ultimately prevail in WWII. “This is not the end. It's not even the beginning of the end. But it may be the end of the beginning,” Churchill soberly observed. And it was.

In a similar fashion, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, during the last days in which he carefully led his 12 Apostles through the planned steps that led to his death and resurrection, took the final steps of His earthly ministry and ascended into heaven. It was the *end of the beginning* of the Christian church.

Today, Trinity continues down its pathway to a new future, charted by the Transforming

Congregations Network process, and ultimately, towards victory not only for ourselves, but for many who have not even heard the story of Jesus' Crucifixion. Whether we ultimately adopt all the steps TCN prescribes or not, we will forever be influenced by the work we are doing to develop a “transformed Trinity.”

We have completed early steps of (1) Reconciliation and (2) Visioning, and step (3) Pastoral Development continues with Pastor's regular meetings in his “learning community” of other TCN pastors.

Remaining are two very big steps to the future: (4) Strategy, including Worship development, and (5) Structure, including Governance simplification.

While many may anxiously await seeing "anything new from TCN," our church leadership is burning the midnight oil writing, reviewing and preparing detailed Strategic Plans for our April 19 "Town Hall" discussion.

Similarly, the Constitution and By Laws have been rewritten and edited through five drafts already. The Executive Board has completed its review and PPC reviews have begun with an ultimate presentation planned for our May 31 Voters' Assembly. At that time, we will either adopt the new governance documents for a two-year trial period or return to the current system.

In between, we'll have a leadership nomination process, an annual budget process and at least one congregation-wide "Town Hall" Workshop to discuss the details

of the proposed new Constitution and By Laws sometime in mid-May.

Much remains to be done. But even more has already been completed. I urge you to not miss a single meeting or workshop so that you're completely informed as to what changes lay ahead and what role you'll play in them.

All this means that May 31 will indeed be "*the end of the beginning*" of Trinity's future. I urge you to pray earnestly and regularly that the Holy Spirit will guide us to the next step in the life of Trinity as we seek to do His will in Orlando.

To Trinity much has been given. From Trinity much is expected. Thanks be to God!

The Easter Vigil – April 11, 6:00 p.m.

The Easter Vigil is a very ancient service with a long and revered tradition, rich in symbolism. After burying the “alleluias” for the season of Lent, and after the somberness and solemnity of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, the time arrives for the people of God to see the tightly sealed tomb bursting forth with resurrection joy.

The congregation gathers outside a darkened sanctuary to remember Baptism, our entrance into the Church, and to light the new fire. We proceed into the sanctuary by candlelight.

The service consists of numerous Old Testament readings (no sermon). Each is the story of God rescuing His people. We celebrate His rescue again of us.

Your typical day before Easter may be spent dyeing eggs, preparing food for the family feast, and perhaps even getting the church ready for Easter Sunday. We invite you to join us for this special, meaningful service this year, Saturday evening, **April 11, 6:00 p.m.** Make it part of your family's tradition!

Station Lead positions (pick one) – *Snack, Music, Opening & Closing, Games, Craft, Video, PreSchool & Kindergarten, Bible Challenge, Middle School*

Should enjoy working with minimal guidance and be at least 18 years old; all materials, T-Shirt, Leader identification, and training supplied. OK to Co-Lead (invite a friend to share the fun!). 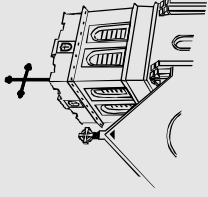
