Resurrection

Christians sure are persistent! The first Christians celebrated weekly anniversaries of the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Every Sunday they gathered on what they called "The Lord's Day" to remember how surprised and overwhelmed they were to discover that Jesus really had bodily risen from the dead.

A hundred thousand Sundays later we still do the same thing! Every Sunday is a little Easter! We haven't tired yet of celebrating his resurrection.

This month, of course, we have the big Easter celebration. It's probably the closest we'll get to heaven until we, well, get to heaven! On April 24th we will focus on the reality of resurrection. It's not wishful thinking. It's not metaphorical. It's nothing other than absolutely true—Jesus is risen from the dead, and we will rise from our own deaths, positively, undoubtedly!

I hope you won't miss any part of the run-up to Easter—Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. These observances are the warm-up for our hearts, helping us identify with Jesus and his disciples by recounting what they went through, with prayers and readings and songs.

And then comes the great day! I have to tell you that if your blood isn't stirred by Holy Week, I'm worried about you. I'm not saying it means you've lost your Christian faith, and I'm not saying it in some accusatory way. I'm just saying that I'm concerned about you, wondering what's been happening in your life to make this incredible week seem "ho-hum" to you. Would you stop for just a minute and ask yourself some diagnostic questions?

- What does it mean to me that Jesus rose from the dead?
- What will happen to me when I die?
- How do I picture heaven?
- How important to me are my Christian friends at church?
- Has something caused me to lose my certainty about my faith?
- How close does God seem to me?
- Am I numb about a lot of things?

•If your doctor asked you questions to look for health clues, you wouldn't feel accused or attacked, would you? I hope you take these questions in the spirit in

The Next Step

A Bazooka Bubblegum wrapper I once read as a kid quoted an ancient Chinese philosopher, saying "A Journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." (Or was that a fortune cookie Pastor Moore shared with me at lunch recently?) Wherever it appeared, this Chinese mantra reminds me of the long-term Campus Development Program we've agreed to undertake as a congregation over the next several years. We call it **Trinity: Century II** in deference to those who devoted so much of themselves to our congregation during its first 100 years.

We don't know how many steps will be needed to complete our 1,000-mile journey, but we do know we've got to start somewhere. And then get there, one step at a time. We took that first step at our Voters' Meeting March 5 when we approved the long-range Master Plan for the property and authorized starting Phase I.

Here is an outline of the Phase I projects and project management teams, and you can watch the web site and the Triune for regular updates as more steps are taken:

All of us will be asked to participate in these various projects. We have a multi-step Work Flow Chart what calls for different steps on different dates for different projects. All six begin with development of Work Scope and cost estimating, and #5 and #6 begin with informal review with city planners and our Lake Eola Heights neighborhood association.

Once design/build contracts are ready for #5 and #6, congregation will be asked to confirm the design details. It will be fun for all, but there will be a lot of steps involved. The key is that we've already taken the first one. Pray for a smooth pathway as our teams get more deeply along.

TLS Children "Bury" the Alleluia

On Ash Wednesday before Chapel, students met at the flag pole to put the Alleluia into a "tomb" and bury it into the ground until Easter. Join us April 27 at 8:30 am to resurrect our Easter word of praise! *What's the difference between "Alleluia" and "Hallelujah"?* Alleluia is Greek. Hallelujah is Hebrew. They both mean "Praise the Lord", and that's why it's buried during our somber season of repentance.

The "King" and "Queen" of Lutheran Chorales – so you can get "extra credit" next time Pastor asks !!

"Wake, Awake, for Night is Flying" (LSB 516) published in 1599 by Philipp Nicolai, has long been called the "King" of Chorales. Known for its text on the wise and foolish virgins, its prominent place in the close of the church year, and its sturdy tune, called the greatest and most solemn melody of Evangelical Christendom, it has been utilized by composers from Bach onward. The "Queen" of Chorales, "How Lovely Shines the Morning Star" (LSB 395) was also published by Nicolai in 1599. Both of these hymns are numbered among the gems of Lutheran hymnody because of their style of diction, poetic structure and grand tunes. Both are forms of acrostics, and both texts are largely word for word from Scripture.

Easter Vigil – April 23 – Start a New Family Tradition!

The Easter Vigil is a very ancient service with a long and revered tradition, rich in symbolism. After burying the "alleluias" for the season of Lent, and after the somberness and solemnity of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday, the time arrives for the people of God to see the tightly sealed tomb

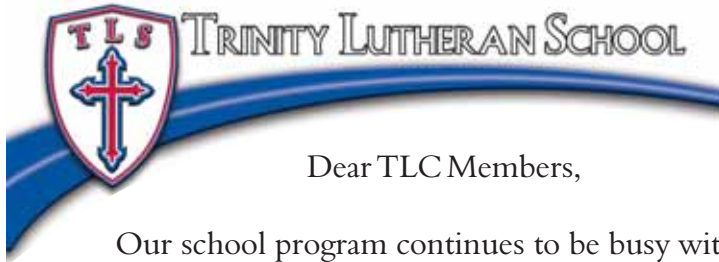

At the annual national-level SkillsUSA Championships, over 5,000 students compete in 96 occupational and leadership skill areas, including preschool teacher. They both will go on to compete against other preschool teachers at the state level in May.

Updates From Our School Ministry

We have been learning about the solar system the past two weeks in our PreK class. I am always so amazed by how quickly children learn. In such a short time they knew that the sun was a star, the name of all nine planets, and that Earth is the only planet that can support life. We had fun creating our galaxy art board and just learning about space through many different mediums. If you ask them about our solar system they are so excited to share with you what they know!



Along with learning about space we also talked about Heaven. Learning about God is a part of everyday in our class at Trinity. Everything is related to God and it is enlightening to hear a child's point of view. We talked in our circle time about what Heaven meant to them. What is Heaven? Where is Heaven? The children, as always, had a lot to say.

Their thoughts are always so fresh and sincere. Heaven to them is a beautiful place way up high, past the clouds and the planets. It is God and Jesus' home. Heaven is filled with angels and people they love. It is a place the children can someday play with their pets that are no longer here on Earth.

Our children have such a special way of reaching our hearts. This man still dearly misses his mother and the thought of a hug from his mom meant so much to him. He was so glad that his daughter was in a school where we can talk about God and Heaven. His daughter had given him what we call a "heartprint" and he will cherish that memory forever.

Most schools only focus on the academic growth of a child. However, our school offers so much more. Trinity Lutheran School helps us to become the loving people that God made us to be. By being able to talk to our students about Jesus and God's love for us, we are creating an environment where our children's hearts can flourish and grow along with their minds.
