Pastor's Page

One People, Forgiven

I had the privilege of serving our East Orlando Circuit as the voting pastoral delegat to the 64th convention of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, held July 10-17, 2010, in Houston. Conventions are held every three years to conduct the regular business of the Synod, but this convention also considered a significant restructuring of the way our 6,000+ congregations walk together serving our Lord Jesus Christ in t h e w o r l d .

Because of the way delegates are chosen, only about 1 congregation in 4 of the Synod has any member there, but Trinity was blessed to also be represented by Jeff Wegner, serving as an advisory delegate representing teachers of the FL-GA district, Liz Borth, representing other called workers as advisory, and Mark Brink, FL-GA District Education Executive.

While the sessions were long and tedious, the work of finding ways that so many diverse congregations can work together made it all worthwhile.

Highlights of the convention include:

- The election of Rev. Matthew Harrison as our new Synodical President

- Major operational restructuring into just two departments, the Office of National Mission and the Office of International Missions
- A strong statement rejecting the position of the ELCA concerning homosexual clergy and same-sex marriages, urging the ELCA to repent of accepting these.
- Strong affirmation of our positions in favor of our military chaplains and Project Barnabas, which aids our soldiers over there and returning home.
- Strong affirmation of our pro-life efforts

The theme of the convention was “One People—Forgiven,” expressed in daily Bible Studies by Mr. Ted Kober of “Ambassadors of Reconciliation,” “Red Chair Videos” by our District Presidents telling powerful stories of confession and forgiveness, and real-life examples as delegates chose to face differences and reconcile on the spot.

Rev. Gerald Kieschnick, President of the Synod for the past 9 years, was thanked for his faithful service and given the title

"All Creatures of Our God and King" Aug/Sept Hymn of the Month

St. Francis of Assisi grew up in a rich Italian home, and had gotten into lots of trouble when he was young. However, at the age of 25, he left this life behind to work among the poor people of Italy. He slept in the fields and preached to the sick and poor. His example of Christ-like love drew others around him, and they were called "Little Brothers of the Poor."

His "Canticle of the Sun" was written over 800 years ago, and was the first religious poem in the Italian language. It is a joyful song of praise to the Creator God, which is remarkable considering Francis was dying at this time, suffering in great pain, in a hot straw hut, unattended by anyone but field mice. The tune is from a German hymn book printed about the time that the Pilgrims were coming to America.

Build on Your Foundation

Representatives of our Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod are gathered in Houston as I write this month's article and by the time you read it, the results of the convention will be old news. But it is not the politics and policy decisions that I want to share with you. The thought-provoking testimonies of forgiveness and the inspirational Bible studies shared in various time slots throughout the business of each day, offered the best action and advice for our Trinity Orlando congregation to take to heart and embrace. In particular, Thursday morning's devotion spoke of our heritage foundation. Our speaker was Dr. Shang Ik Moon, a native of Seoul Korea. Dr. Moon asked us if he looked like a descendent of Saxon Germans. Of course, there was a burst of laughter from the assembly, but Dr. Moon's intention was to draw us to the fact that our church heritage foundation is not cultural or geographical. 1 Peter 2:10 and 11 clearly indicate not one of us are God's people by virtue of ancestry bloodlines or traditions. Our one-ness comes only from God. Through Christ alone are we uniquely bound together in heritage.

One does not have to be German to appreciate the risk Martin Luther took in declaring himself an outlaw of the church. He firmly claimed One Faith and One Grace. In a world where he was surrounded with

political differences and hate, even death threats, Luther stood firmly on One Scripture. In the early 19th century, Saxon Germans, fled political injustice in order to stand firm on Scripture. When the world and society teach and demonstrate lifestyle and teachings contrary to Scripture, we must stand firm! Trinity may claim heritage in Orlando as an historical landmark to the city and to the Florida-Georgia District, but prayerfully this is not where we "hang our hat". We are connected by heritage to Jesus Christ by God's grace alone, through the Holy Scriptures alone, by faith alone. Today, the 21st century may seem too different and much too difficult to stand firm, but truly, it is not much different than the earliest Christians. Focus on John 17:16 choosing not to interpret the meaning as "don't get involved in worldly matters" and you will find comfort. Truly, when Jesus prays to His Father expressing a desire on our behalf, He is not asking that we be removed from the world and every thing that living in a temporal abode might mean. He is stating a fact and asking we be strengthened, protected, and unified. You see, since our heritage is not cultural, ethical, or societal, but Scriptural, we are bound together as one. I believe most of you share my hope for unity in our church business is based on our unity as God's people in Christ Jesus.
