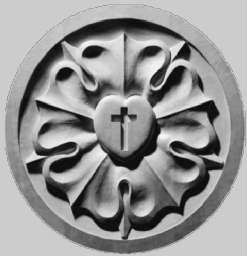

## Pastor's Page

### *The Insanity Defense*

If you were in church on June 14-15 you heard me say that Trinity needs to make some changes, based on the old definition, "If you keep doing the same thing and expect different results, that's insanity!"

While I was in St. Louis I copied down the statistics of Trinity for every year since 1919, and found that we have not grown since 1961. In fact, in some categories, like Sunday School, we're very much smaller since then. Of course, I'm just talking about numbers—but Jesus talks about numbers, too, and the Book of Acts is full of them!

That's because every number represents a soul that Jesus died for. He would leave 99 to fend for themselves in order to save one! We, on the other hand, have

this tendency to celebrate the fact that we have 99 and work to make sure that most of those 99 stay with us, and who cares about the one?

Let me make clear what I'm NOT saying: I'm NOT saying that Trinity hasn't done anything for 50 years. I'm NOT saying that Trinity hasn't been served by faithful pastors, faculty, staff, and volunteers who have loved the Lord and tried to do His work. I'm NOT saying that the past 50 years have been wasted. Far from it!

During those same 50 years Trinity's school has shared the love of Jesus with at least 1,500 children! Several hundred people have confessed before Trinity congregation that they believe in Jesus Christ as their Savior. Hundreds of couples have promised themselves to each other in Holy

Matrimony. More than a thousand children have been baptized into the name of Jesus. And who knows how many people have walked away from a worship service here at Trinity finally knowing that, yes, indeed, their sins are forgiven and they have peace with God?

The fact that Trinity is still here in downtown Orlando to share the Gospel is certainly an achievement worth celebrating, and next year we will indeed celebrate 90 years of faithful ministry here. Trinity survived the Florida Bust of the late 1920's, the Great Depression of the 1930's, and the decline of downtown especially in the 1970's. God has been gracious just to keep us here.

So I'm not saying that nothing has happened here. What I am saying is this: Orlando is four

times (at least!) the size it was in 1961. Some downtown churches are also many times the size they were then. Trinity is not. I'm not OK with that, and I don't believe God smiles when he thinks about it, either. I don't think the angels in heaven are rejoicing over Trinity.

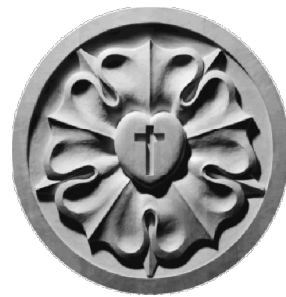
No, I think God and His holy angels are wondering what's up with a Christian congregation that has the Word and Sacraments in their truth and purity, situated in an explosively growing community, staying the same size for 50 years. I'm wondering the same thing. And as I wonder, here's what I'm asking: How can I change, and is Trinity willing to make the necessary changes, so that more people will turn to Jesus and join us in seeking still more?

If you're thinking the way I'm thinking, then let's get to work! Let's take a deep, honest, hard look at ourselves, first of all, and then at the way we do things here. We committed to doing just that when we signed up for the

Transforming Churches Network on May 25. Now let's put that into action.

As you're reading this you should have seen an article in the Triune for a week or two inviting your input into our congregational self-study. If you haven't shared that input, the deadline is very close, so please do so!

Finally, first, last, and always, pray to the Lord of the harvest to send forth workers into His harvest field, knowing that His answer very likely calls for you to make changes!



## Prepare the Way

Strange how our language serves us differently at different times, isn't it. This little phrase, for instance, offers Christians a scrapbook of instant images from "eating locusts and honey" to "wearing a hair shirt" and baptisms in the Jordan River (John, the Baptist, of course).

This summer, to those of us at Trinity, this phrase presents a new message with a totally different meaning than the ancient scrolls.

Right here, right now, "Prepare The Way" challenges us to anticipate the arrival of a whole new cadre of Christian servants soon to join us around the Trinity campus.

In our school, for instance, we'll soon be working with at least three new teachers, a

## A from Your Music Director

### Summer Projects

The **Parish Choir** is learning John Rutter's *Mass for the Children* as we prepare for our New York City trip and singing in Carnegie Hall with John Rutter, conducting. Our **Women's Choir** is rehearsing to record our first CD this summer with many of our favorites on it.

### Carnegie Hall – Architecture and History

Carnegie Hall is one of the last large buildings in New York built entirely of masonry, without a steel frame; however, when several flights of studio spaces were added to the building near the turn of the 20th century, a steel framework was erected around segments of the building. The exterior is rendered in narrow Roman bricks of a mellow ochre hue, with details in terra cotta and brownstone. The foyer avoids contemporary Baroque theatrics with a high-minded exercise in the Florentine Renaissance manner of Filippo Brunelleschi's Pazzi Chapel: white plaster and gray stone form a harmonious system of round-headed arched openings and Corinthian pilasters that support an unbroken cornice, with round-headed lunettes above it, under a vaulted

ceiling. The famous white and gold interior is similarly restrained.

Carnegie Hall is named after Andrew Carnegie, who paid for its construction. It was intended as a venue for the Oratorio Society of New York and the New York Symphony Society, on whose boards Carnegie served. Construction began in 1890, and was carried out by Isaac A. Hopper and Company. Although the building was in use from April 1891, the official opening night was on May 5, with a concert conducted by maestro Walter Damrosch and composer Peter Ilyich Tchaikovsky. Originally known simply as "Music Hall" (the words "Music Hall founded by Andrew Carnegie" still appear on the façade above the marquee), the hall was renamed Carnegie Hall in 1893 after board members of the Music Hall Company of New York (the hall's original governing body) persuaded Carnegie to allow the use of his name. Several alterations were made to the building between 1893 and 1896, including the addition of two towers of artists' studios, and alterations to the auditorium on the building's lower level.

The hall was owned by the Carnegie family until 1925, when Carnegie's widow sold it to a real estate developer, Robert E. Simon. When Simon died in 1935, his son, Robert E. Simon Jr. took over. By the mid-1950s, changes in the music business prompted Simon to offer Carnegie Hall for sale to the New York Philharmonic, which booked a majority of the hall's concert dates each year. The orchestra declined, since they planned to move to Lincoln Center, then in the early stages of planning. At the time, it was widely believed that New York City could not support two major concert venues. Facing the loss of the hall's primary tenant, Simon was forced to offer the building for sale. A deal with a commercial developer fell through, and by 1960, with the New York Philharmonic on the move to Lincoln Center, the building was slated for demolition to make way for a commercial skyscraper. Under pressure from a group led by violinist Isaac Stern and many

of the artist residents, special legislation was passed that allowed the city of New York to buy the site from Simon for \$5 million, and in May of 1960 the nonprofit Carnegie Hall Corporation was created to run the venue. It was designated a National Historic Landmark in 1962.

## A Servant's Heart

This month marks the one year anniversary of my consecration as a Deaconess. For most of you, I am the first Deaconess you have ever encountered. It is incredible that most Lutheran church members as well as clergy have neither worked with a Deaconess, nor have a true understanding of the service deaconesses give to the church. So, in honor of my consecration and with thanksgiving to you all for calling me as your Deaconess, I would like to share the work of my sisters to further enlighten you as to the valuable service of women called to serve our Lutheran Church as deaconesses.

A person is often defined by what they *do*, and what one *does* is often associated with a job title. While a title such as teacher, file clerk,

director of admissions, or accountant, may describe the duties of a job, there are some titles that do not adequately describe the responsibilities or expectations of the position. Deaconess is certainly one of those titles.

Deaconess is a derivative of *Diakonia*, the word used by Apostle Paul in describing ministering and serving. So, by the definition of *diakonia*, a deaconess ministers and serves. Pretty clear now what a deaconess does isn't it? No? Well, perhaps this definition of the deaconess office by Deaconess Kristin Wassilak may help: "it is an office of care for souls, teaching the Word, and works of mercy". Maybe you are still a little foggy on deaconess duties. So, read this description of

deaconess ministry by Rev. Matthew Harrison, Executive Director of the LCMS World Relief/Human Care: "The deaconess is a woman, theologically trained and competent, supportive of the church's public confession, who gives herself to a special need in the church's life. The tasks are as varied as the women themselves." You see, how deaconesses serve a church, institution, or mission depends on the need of the church, institution, or mission. Our duties are not defined by a title, but by the needs of those we serve and the gifts we receive from God. Deaconess Renee' in Oklahoma is the Youth Minister of her church and school; Deaconess Pam in Missouri is Senior Editor for Sunday school and youth and family materials for Concordia Publishing House; Deaconess Sara in Pennsylvania writes and teaches Bible

studies and cares for the elderly in a nursing home/retirement center; Deaconess Sara writes grants for Lutheran World Relief; and many more sister deaconesses serve in music ministry, family ministry, prison ministry, and hospital chaplaincy. What we all share is a spiritual passion to serve Jesus Christ and His church.

My "job" and that of all deaconesses in our Lutheran church, is for you to see Jesus in our service to you. My position and that of all deaconesses in our Lutheran church, is to share with you the confession that Jesus Christ is our Lord and Savior, the Son of God who is our Redeemer, and to point you in the direction of the altar where you receive forgiveness, life, and hope.

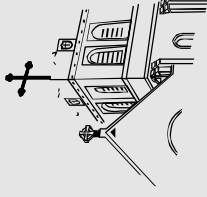

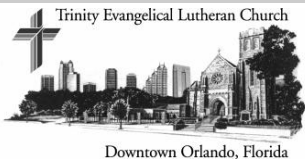
