Compassion

We have this nice English word, compassion, to describe a sort of feeling we get when we see someone struggling. Our word comes from the Latin, and if you really examine it, the Latin suggests that compassion means, "it's happening to me, too." The Greek and Hebrew words have an even stronger meaning—they describe a reaction in the belly, like we've also been "kicked in the gut."

Compassion Corner has been a ministry of First Presbyterian for about 8 years, but in God's stewardship of His resources, it now operates on Trinity's campus, right next to our Ministry Center on Magnolia. I've had a chance to get to know the folks who've been active in this ministry, and I have to say that all the meanings of "compassion" seem to come together in them. They aren't putting a distance between themselves and the folks they minister to. The hurts of those who have no home are their hurts, too. They feel it in their gut.

These folks also have learned how to give of themselves without getting burned out. That's because the love of Christ that supplies their needs never runs out! They have discovered how to give from an unending storehouse of riches, and are growing stronger, not weaker, the more they give.

Frankly, I want that for us, too! A

handful of Trinity members have gotten involved in this ministry, and they can tell you that I'm speaking the truth. I don't think it's greedy for me to say, "I want more!" More Trinity members giving of themselves—no, giving from Christ's abundant mercy—to those in real need.

Compassion Corner has just started opening on Friday mornings, but really they don't have quite enough volunteers to do so. They've had to rob from Monday to make Friday work! I've mentioned a couple of times that there's a real opportunity for Trinity here, to expand the outreach of this ministry. If you have a schedule that allows you some weekday mornings off, especially either Monday or Friday, please talk to Deaconess Liz, or call the church office, to get connected up with Dawn or Darrell at Compassion Corner. The work is not hard. It's not scary or unpleasant. The work is simply sharing the love of Christ (often by handing someone a cup of coffee) with people who desperately need that love.

You don't hear me talk much in church about the financial crisis in our world today. That's because I can't shake the feeling that much of it is well-deserved. Just like the outrageously inflated housing prices a couple of years ago, our whole financial system has been based on

greed and speculation for so long that we don't even remember how an economy ought to be put together. For many of us, the financial crisis means that investments we weren't planning on selling soon aren't worth as much as they were two years ago. When I did my taxes I discovered that there are a few less dollars in my retirement fund today—but I'm not retiring soon, anyway! Big deal! All that means is that the prices for the investments that are going into my retirement today are bargains!

But there are many for whom the situation is much more serious. We have a number of members of Trinity looking for jobs for the first time in decades. Some will probably have to relocate to find work, and we'll miss them when they go. Some are dependent on their retirement investments right now. Some are having to make radical changes in their lives. It's time for Trinity to learn about compassion through more than just ministry to persistently homeless people, as important and rewarding as that ministry is. We need to demonstrate to each other that we really are the Body of Christ. I urge you to open up to your friends at church, and let them know what's really going on in your life. I don't know whether we need some kind of program to help each other, but I do know we need to be growing closer one-on-one. Someone at Trinity may need some

resources that you know about. Someone may have the answer you've been looking for. Please be diligent in prayer for each member of our family here, but especially those who are newly unemployed or underemployed.

Some of our staff are really hurting, too. In order to bring expenses under control, we've transferred some of the cost of health care to our full-time workers, and have also increased their deductibles and reduced their benefits. For those on the low end of our salary scale, this has effectively cut their pay by about 25%. People who are just above minimum wage, many of them single moms, have a hard time losing a quarter of their pay.

There are so many opportunities for compassion in our current situation. Our church can grow closer to what God has called us to be now! Look at all your past experience. When do you grow? When everything is fine, with no bumps in the road? Hardly. We grow when we're challenged! We grow when we recognize that we truly do need the love and forgiveness of our Lord Jesus Christ. We grow when we cry out to Him for rescue. We grow when we reach out to other Christians for help in difficult times.

May God hear and answer our prayers in this time of challenge and opportunity! God bless you!

A Servants Heart

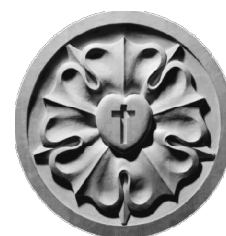
We, the members of Trinity Church and School, are changing our constitution, by-laws, and organizational structure, but these changes will not change the dependence our body of Christ has on volunteer or "unpaid staff" hours. Imagine what our worship services would be like without the gifts and talents of volunteer service time. We might handle a search for worship folders; or dismiss the lack of a welcoming smile and handshake at the door. We could tolerate placing our offering into a basket or plate as we enter or exit, and simply comment that missing a choir and other instrumentalists is a shame. If there were no acolytes and no readers, it would merely be an inconvenience. Without nursery attendants our worship experience would probably include more little voices, but children need to learn worship practices anyway. Sure, the Bible study hour wouldn't exist without leaders and Sunday school teachers, but a good sermon could fill that void. However, if there is no one to make certain we have donuts and coffee, then something *really* must be done! Seriously, what would our church be like without volunteers?

As people become more and more selective in how they use their limited free time, service to the church fails to be a priority. Families would rather spend time at a theme park than a church picnic, but a church picnic can only happen if there are volunteers spending time planning and executing it. God's model for us to work together as one body is outlined in 1 Corinthians 12, and that Scripture passage clearly states we are *all* needed and should work together as one. So, why are so few doing the bulk of the work? Why should we volunteer at all? If our purpose is to earn the approval of God, we are wasting our time, because Isaiah writes in chapter 64 verse 6, "all our righteous acts are like filthy rags". If

our motivation is to gain man's approval, we can certainly say with the author of Ecclesiastes, "all is meaningless." Well then, why should we be more involved in our church? Because involvement in the church is involvement in Christ's ministry. Each of us needs the help and guidance of other Christians as we follow Christ, and as contributing members in the faith community, we gain a sense of belonging. As a result of activity, witness, mission, and service, by those inside the congregation, the church will grow.

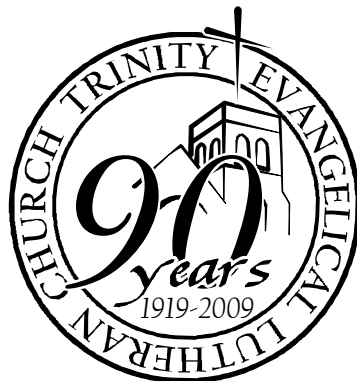

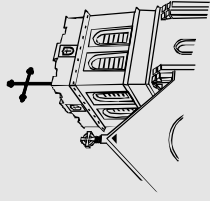
