## Pastor's Page

*Why Does Trinity Have  
a School?*

Have you ever wondered? It's a very important question, you know! If for no other reason, it's important because Trinity expends nearly \$2 million per year in caring for children from birth to eighth grade!

Why does any community operate a school? Think about the pioneers on the frontier-why did they take time and scarce resources to build a little one-room schoolhouse and hire a young man or woman to teach their children? Think about the greater metropolitan Orlando community-why are hundreds of millions of tax dollars spent each year to educate children here?

The quick and easy answer is, "We've always done it that way!" After all, less than

50 of Trinity's current members were members when our school began in 1953, and many of them were too young to be a part of any decision making then. For the rest of us, there was already a school when we got here! "We've always had a school!"

But that answer doesn't help much, does it? You and I have inherited the precious gift of a Christian school, and therefore have the responsibility to be good stewards of that resource placed in our hands by God. Certainly we need to know why we even have one!

One thing I'm thankful for-I know that Trinity didn't start its school for the wrong reasons! There are two main wrong reasons that Lutheran churches have started schools in the past, and neither applies

here. First, we started our school too late to have started it so that our German children could be educated in German! For some Lutheran schools that's the real reason they began. Yes, they also had some other, better reasons, but that was arguably the reason behind the stated reasons. On the other hand, we started our school too early to have started it for racist reasons. The Supreme Court decisions that began racial integration came too long after the original push to start the school for anyone to suggest that the Lutherans wanted to keep their children in an all-white environment. So Trinity is off the hook in terms of starting our school for these wrong reasons.

I would argue that Trinity operates its school (and day care) because we believe that children need to grow up

in an environment that is not only physically safe but ethically and morally safe, too; because we believe that God created this world, and the only right way to learn about this world is to study it as a child of God learning about His creation; because we believe that we can do a better job as parents if our children are in a school that is directly responsive and responsible to the parents; because we believe that worship and devotion are a necessary part of true education; and because we love children and want them to live in heaven forever.

Now, not every child who enters our day care or school is a member of Trinity. We invite into our care others who may go to different churches, or may not even be Christians. When these families come to us, they may be attracted to some of the benefits without valuing all of them. For example, our size may be attractive to someone who really doesn't care that we also have devotions and worship services. That's OK. We're not trying to impose anything on our school families. On the other hand, we're going to keep running our school with the values we believe in, and we will continue to share those values with the children. All non-member families of Trinity are informed that this is a Lutheran Christian school, and no one has the option to "opt-out" of chapel, religious instruction, etc.

Quite the contrary. While we don't try to force anything on anyone, we are constantly inviting our families to consider our values, to trust in our Savior, to raise their children according to the Word of God at home as well as at Trinity. And many of our school families do grow in their faith through the witness of our school. In fact, Trinity has a good number of members who first came here because of our school, and grew into members of Trinity.

Trinity has wonderful teachers, workers, and volunteers who make all this come together every day in the lives of our children. What a precious gift these people are to us!

As we begin a new school year I encourage every member of Trinity, whether or not we have children in the school, to pray that God will use our school in a powerful way to work in the lives of children and their families. And if you have been looking for a place to serve God as a volunteer, I encourage you to call the school office to see how you might help.

Why do we have a school? Because God gave us this precious gift to cherish and to use as a tool as we share Him with all those around us!

Too often what people perceive is their truth and looks can be deceiving. The problem is mine for not taking care of the machine, as it should be cared for. I can make all kinds of excuses and give many valid reasons for the lack of maintenance and repair, but the fact still remains that the car is inoperable and sits unused in the garage.

A church can give the impression of being well off or prosperous by the look of the impressive buildings and property. Outsiders may also pay attention to the flow of people on Sunday mornings or the amount and type of cars in the parking lot. Brochures and advertisements as well as an Internet website list a myriad of activities. The perception is a growing and prosperous church. What about this church, YOUR church? Is this description of Trinity a perception or is it truth? Before you answer, let's look at one traditional and program.

We have over 300 children ages 3 to 16 listed as members of Trinity Lutheran Church. Our Sunday school 2005/2006 roster indicates only 30% of those children are registered in

Sunday school classes. Of those less than ½ have attended more than 50% of the time! What is happening to our parish education program for children? We can give all kinds of reasons and excuses for the lack of growth and attendance, but it appears the Sunday school program is in danger of dying. In order to keep anything running smoothly, whether machine or program, maintenance is essential. The Sunday school cannot continue without people willing to give their talent and time to teach or assist the teachers. Parents bear the responsibility for training their child “in the way he should go” and Sunday school assists you with that responsibility. The religious training of our children cannot continue without your help. Trinity chose to begin Stephen Ministry training in 2000 in response to God's love and Jesus' command in John 13: 34. Stephen Ministers answer this call in a special way by "being there" for people who need a Christian presence amid the struggles of life.
