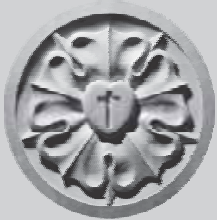

Pastor's Page

All You Need Is Love

When I counsel with couples before their weddings we talk about love, of course. While we discuss romantic love, as in "I'm in love with you," that won't get two people through decades of living together as husband and wife. Romantic love is nice, it's exciting, and it's short-lived. The love that God commands us all to have for each other, and which is the bare minimum for married couples, is defined for us in First Corinthians Thirteen, St. Paul's famous Love Chapter. There he describes the love that is necessary if people are going to live together, work together, raise children together, and never, never, never give up.

As we talk this through in premarital counseling, it becomes obvious that only Jesus

really loves this way, especially by the time we get to "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things—Love never fails." That's not the love we come up with from inside our hearts! No, we need to receive that kind of love from Jesus, and, filled with that love, pass it along to our spouse, our children, and ultimately all the people that qualify as our neighbors (which, according the parable of the Good Samaritan, is quite a large crowd!).

We can see that from another angle. Jesus plainly commands us in John Thirteen, "Love one another as I have loved you." We receive his love and love others with that same love. When we do, others can tell that we are Jesus' disciples. When we don't, they're not sure, and we're not obedient.

Living out decades of marriage as God intends is sometimes hard. Life is complex. There are times when a good marriage seems more like a business partnership than a romantic relationship, especially while raising children. To succeed, we need the unconditional love of Christ, the love that was so constant that he loved us while we were still his enemies. That love still holds on to us when we're being pretty unlovable even today. Because that love forgives us, Jesus really does bear all things.

Any attempt to live and work together calls for the same love. As a congregation you and I have so much we're called to do! We need to work together to reach out with the Gospel to our mission field near and far. We're doing that every

day here at Trinity as we care for children, giving us the opportunity to share the Good News not only with those children, but with their families as well. We do that as we worship God openly each weekend. We do that as we reach out through our mission dollars all over the world.

All that work together generates friction. For example, think about a classroom full of children. Each child has a different capacity for paying attention to the teacher. Some need constant supervision to stay on task, while others work fairly independently. Because they're real humans, most will succumb to temptation sometime during the day, talking out of turn, copying someone else's work, pulling a prank on another, saying something unkind . . . The list goes on, and that doesn't even include the pure accidents—milk spilled, tripping on the playground (or in a perfectly clear and level hallway!), dropping any number of things . . . That list also goes on! Now think of the teacher who needs to cover the day's lesson plans, discipline the pranksters, comfort the child with the skinned knee or hurt feelings, etc. She's putting out a lot of love. Meanwhile the CDC worker has changed more diapers in a day than most fathers change in a lifetime, the pastor has just gotten

off the phone with someone who's borderline suicidal, the custodian has cleaned up the third pile of vomit today, the secretary has just been chewed out because someone's announcement missed the Triune . . . All these people are doing their best, working hard, being challenged and stressed.

They also need to work together every day. Throw into the mix some volunteers who have had similar days at their workplace before coming to serve on a committee, maybe without supper . . .

What am I saying? I'm saying that we're a real working congregation, and we're called to do that work with love for each other. That calls for the same commitment that marriage calls for, that we're going to find a way to get past any friction, to forgive any sin, to love each other no matter what. If we don't, how will anyone know that we're Jesus' disciples?

Please think about all your fellow members at Trinity. Every one is someone Jesus calls you to love with the same love he has given you. Can they tell you love them? Have you told them? Does it show? These are things I'd like us to work on this summer.

The task is challenging this year because we are working on changing our governing structure. This means we need to devise a slate of candidates that addresses our current structure as well as the proposed structure. Our current By-Laws require a slate to fill the following positions:

- Executive Director (President) (1)
- Assistant Executive Directors (3)
- Treasurer (1)
- Assistant Treasurer (1)
- Congregational Secretary (1)

- Board of Elders (Men only are eligible)
 - Director plus at least 7
- Board of Evangelism
 - Director plus at least 7
- Board of School Ministries
 - Director plus at least 6
- Board of Parish Education
 - Director plus at least 5
- Board of Youth Ministries
 - Director plus at least 2
- Board of Stewardship
 - Director plus at least 7
- Board of Church Properties
 - Director plus at least 5
- Board of Parish Fellowship
 - Director plus at least 4
- Board of Public Relations
 - Director plus at least 1
- Board of Social Ministry/Human Care
 - Director plus at least 4

The new proposed structure (at this point in time) provides for election of:

- Five (5) elected officers
 - President; President-Elect;
- Two (2) Vice Presidents; and Treasurer

- Committee Chairs of:
- Elders; Evangelism; School Ministries; Stewardship; Parish Education; Youth Ministries; Public Relations; Church Properties; Fellowship; Social Ministry/Human Care

The Nominating Committee needs to prepare for our current structure. If the Voters Assembly adopts the proposed new structure, then the “extra mile” preparation for the current structure can be used to provide the new officers and committee chairs with the names of those willing to serve on the various committees.

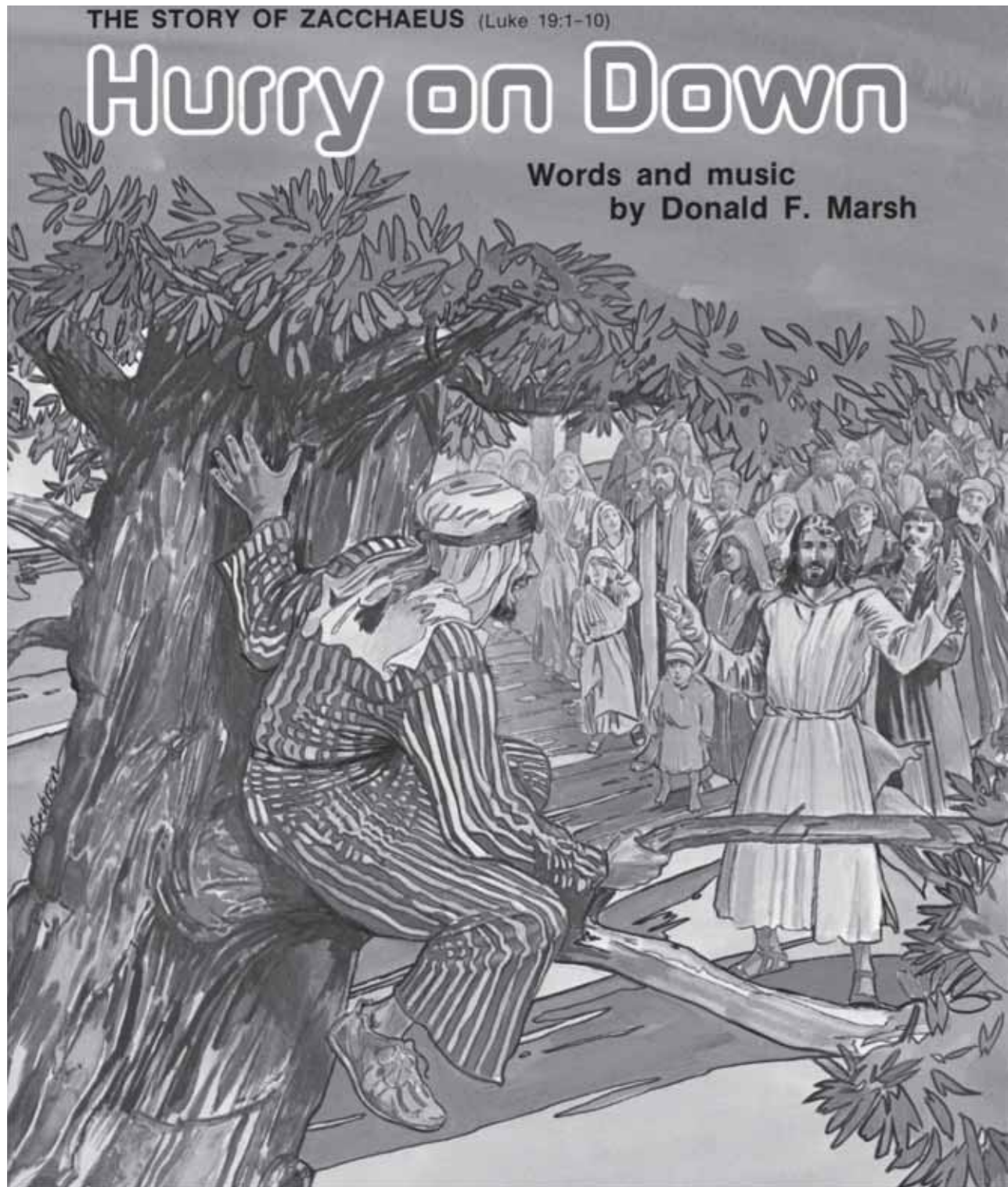

Macau Update

Seeking Miracles

Every Friday night, at our free English Bible study, we read a story from Jesus' life. The stories have been rewritten in simpler English. Last week's topic was the healing of a paralytic. The story began:

"One day Jesus was teaching. Men had come from many distant towns to hear the strange new things He was saying. The Pharisees, the enemies of Jesus, were also there. They wanted to find some fault in the teachings of Jesus. While Jesus was speaking, some men brought their friend to see Jesus. Their friend was lying on a bed. This man was paralyzed and could not move."

You can read the rest of the story in Mark 2:1-12. In fact, please take a moment to do so now.

Although the passage I quoted is not taken directly from Scripture, it is only too true. Note the three very different reasons that people came to see Jesus. Some came out of curiosity: "to hear the strange new things He was saying." Some came seeking—expecting—to criticize and find fault. Still others came because they believed.

I wondered how many of the students there that evening had come merely out of idle curiosity or in hopes of improving their English. Few of them would openly admit to being Christian. When asked about their faith, most answer, "I'm not a Christian. Maybe someday." "Perhaps in the future." God has been working in some of their hearts for many years, but something is still standing in their way. Sam and Tim are two examples. Sam has been attending Bible studies at the Center for four years now. Tim seems so close to believing, but he is waiting to see a miracle.

Interesting. Look again at Mark 2:1-12. How many miracles can you find in the story? There is the obvious: Jesus healed a paralyzed man. There is the hidden: Jesus read the Pharisees' minds. And then there is the most important miracle in the story—one that we frequently read over without noticing. Jesus forgave a man his sins. How incredible is that?

Sometimes, like Tim, we are so busy looking for the big, showy miracles, that we miss the greatest miracle—the miracle of our salvation.

And then there are those who come because they truly believe. It is such a joy to watch people like Susan, to see their eagerness to learn more, to witness their "aha" moments. Susan is a baptized Christian. She is a young believer, but she is eager to learn and to grow. She attends our Bible studies on Tuesday nights, Wednesday mornings, and Friday nights. She also interprets the sermon for us on Sunday mornings.

Pray with me for all who attend our free English Bible studies, whatever their reason for coming may be. Pray for those, like Tim, Sam, and others, whom Satan is working hard to keep from believing. Pray for Susan and other believers as they seek to grow in their faith.

"Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving. At the same time, pray also for us, that God may open to us a door for the Word, to declare the mystery of Christ, [. . .] that [we] may make it clear, which is how [we] ought to speak. [Pray that we may] conduct [ourselves] wisely toward outsiders, making the best use of the time [and that our] speech [may] always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that [we] may know how [we] ought to answer each person." A birthday gift

Gift giving is an important part of Chinese culture. When someone takes a trip, s/he brings back small gifts for his/her family and friends. I have received dried squid, preserved quail eggs, and Coke-flavored candy from Taiwan; spicy dried fish from Thailand; dried cheese candy from Mongolia; and dried prune(?) strips from one of the Chinese provinces. When John and May returned from their honeymoon in Thailand, they brought me back a Thai skirt.

One of my students in particular loves to shower me with gifts. When my application for my work visa was accepted, she bought me two kinds of (expensive) dark chocolate (only after I told her I couldn't drink wine). When she went to Taiwan, she brought me back the above-mentioned food. When she found out I wanted to learn Chinese, she bought me several different text/workbooks designed for younger students. (That's right—I'm back to learning to write like a kindergartener!)

I had every intention of giving her a birthday gift, but her birthday came and went before I knew it. When she found out my birthday is in July, she asked me what I wanted. I reminded her that I had missed her birthday and told her that she didn't need to give me anything. Her answer was the greatest gift she could have given me.

“I don't want anything,” she said. “I think that money is not so important. The only gift I want is for you to pray for me.”

Tara is nominally Catholic but does not attend church regularly. She seems to have a basic knowledge of Catholic teachings, but I am not sure if that knowledge includes knowing her Savior. Her request for prayer took me so by surprise that I almost didn't know what to answer.

Please pray with me for Tara and my other English students. Some, like Tara, are nominally Catholic but haven't set foot inside a church in years. Some claim no religion at all. And a precious few of them “do not despise preaching and [God's] Word, but hold it sacred, and gladly hear and learn it.”

Outdoor Eating Food Safety Tips

The picnic and barbeque season traditionally begins on Memorial Day weekend. To protect yourself, your family, and friends from food borne illness, practice safe food handling techniques when eating outdoors. Keep these tips in mind when preparing, storing, and cooking food for picnics and barbecues.

Before You Begin

- Food safety begins with hand-washing even in outdoor settings. And it can be as simple as using a water jug, some soap, and paper towels.
- Keep all utensils and platters clean when preparing food.



Safe Grilling Tips

- Marinate foods in the refrigerator, not on the counter or outdoors. If some of the marinade is to be used as a sauce on the cooked food, reserve a portion separately before adding the raw meat, poultry, or seafood. Do not reuse marinade.
- Do not use the same platter and utensils that previously held raw meat or seafood to serve cooked meats and seafood.
- If you partially cook food in the microwave, oven, or stove to reduce grilling time, do so immediately before the food goes on the hot grill.
- When it's time to cook the food, cook it thoroughly. Use a food thermometer to be sure.
- Beef, veal, and lamb steaks and roasts-140° (rare) 160° (medium) 170° (well-done)
- Ground pork and ground beef-160°F.
- Poultry breasts-165°F.
- Whole poultry (take measurement in the thigh)-165°F.
- Fin fish-145°F or until the flesh is opaque and separates easily with a fork.

- Shrimp, lobster, and crabs-the meat should be pearly and opaque.
- Clams, oysters, and mussels-until the shells are open.
- Grilled food can be kept hot until served by moving it to the side of the grill rack, just away from the coals where it can overcook.

When You Serve Food

- Keep cold foods cold and hot foods hot.
 - Do not use a plate that previously held raw meat, poultry, or seafood for anything else unless the plate has first been washed in hot, soapy water.
 - Hot food should be kept hot, at or above 140°F. Wrap well and place in an insulated container.
 - Foods like chicken salad and desserts in individual serving dishes can also be placed directly on ice, or in a shallow container set in a deep pan filled with ice. Drain off water as ice melts and replace ice frequently.
 - Don't let perishable food sit out longer than 2 hours.
 - Food should not sit out for more than 1 hour in temperatures above 90°F
- FDA/Center for Food Safety & Applied Nutrition
