Let's Get Together!

As the school year ends we're saying more than the usual good-byes. With Pastor Jon's acceptance of the call to Wisconsin, along with several on our school staff leaving, it would be easy to melt into a little puddle of tears and mope for a while! Certainly we will have a period of "mourning" for these faithful fellow-workers in the Gospel whom we'll no longer see daily here. I know I'm going to miss them.

Tests That Can Save Your Life!

The Human Care/Social Ministry Board is sponsoring Life Line Screening here at our church on Thursday, June 7th, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. to offer preventive healthcare ultrasound screenings. You MUST pre-register, so call 1-800-324-1851 for your appointment.

Life Line Screening offers four non-invasive and completely painless tests that take about ten minutes or less, and offer you an opportunity for early detection and prevention of stroke, heart disease, aneurysm, and osteoporosis. All results are sent directly to you, with encouragement to take them back to your primary care physician. In addition, as a complement to these ultrasound screenings, Life Line Screening offers two simple finger-stick blood tests to identify risk factors for heart disease and diabetes. Participants will receive these results at the screening.

Package prices are:

Vascular package price = \$109

2 blood test package = \$60

Vascular package with blood tests = \$169

Complete Wellness Package (includes osteoporosis screening) = \$129
Complete Wellness Package with blood tests = \$189

Remember, this is an opportunity for preventative healthcare, at a reasonable price, in a familiar place, at a time of your choosing. Call Life Line for the appointment, as our church office will not have scheduling information.

Macau Update

As I step off the shuttle bus, I spot a familiar face. Maria, a young woman from Brazil, greets me with a kiss on each cheek. She introduces me to her companion, a middle-aged man who has spent more than half of his life in Macau, and we chat about inconsequential matters. Maria's English is flawless; she is beautiful, well-dressed, and friendly. After a few minutes, she asks me if I think life on earth will ever be perfect, then reads me Revelation 21:4:

He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.

A message of hope for a people of despair. Perfect. She is so good at what she does.

That was when it hit me just how dangerous this battle really is. We know that we are fighting against Satan, *against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world, and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.* (Ephesians 6:12)

But Satan doesn't run around in a red suit with horns and a tail and a pitchfork. Sometimes Satan himself masquerades as an angel of light. (2 Corinthians 11:14)

Sometimes he betrays us with a kiss on both cheeks. You see, Maria is a Jehovah's Witness.

Satan knows God's Word. And unlike us, he's not afraid to use it. Remember what he said in the garden? *Did God really say, "You must not eat from any tree in the garden?"* (Genesis 3:1)

Satan knew exactly what God said. But see how close his words are to the real thing. Just twisted enough to create a shadow of doubt in Eve's mind. Worse yet, check out Luke 4:9-11:

ICE CREAM



The best temperature for scooping ice cream is 8 to 12 degrees F.

Ice cream should be stored at 0 to -10 degrees F. to maintain its texture.

When you eat ice cream, or any hard frozen dessert, you may get a very painful headache or “brain freeze”. This is caused by the swelling of blood vessels in the nerve center located above the roof of your mouth. When intense cold from the ice cream hits the roof of your mouth the spasms interrupt the blood flow and cause the vessels to swell. To stop a brain freeze try drinking warm water or pressing your tongue against the roof of your mouth so as to warm up the area. Or to avoid this, just eat your ice cream slower.
