Jon arrived, and now I'm back on track again.

People learn in different ways, of course. I learn a lot from just daily life, but, for me, involvement in a degree program provides direction and discipline that brings about tremendous growth. By God's grace, Trinity has a tradition of encouraging this kind of growth among its pastors and teachers. Many of our teachers have Master's Degrees, while others are enrolled in Master's programs. Still others are involved in the Colloquy program, adding Lutheran theological training to their secular education. Part of Trinity's budget is devoted to this ongoing education, and I thank you for your contributions to our education.

What about you? Are you learning still? Do you want to? I'm not saying you have to pursue a higher degree, but I will say that I don't think God is finished with you yet, no matter how old you are! Some of our older members, in fact some of our oldest, talk to me about the new things they're learning, and their excitement is contagious!

Of course, the most important area of learning is the Word of God. Unless you already know everything in the Bible, I'd like to encourage you to begin (or continue) a program of regular study of the Scriptures. Trinity offers many opportunities for Bible Study, which you'll find listed in the Triune Weekly. The Way on Wednesday nights offers short courses, usually 4-7 weeks each, with a break in between each session. If you haven't tried The Way yet, watch for the next session to start, and come. Sunday mornings at 9:30 Pastor Jon and I team up, with whoever is not preaching leading Bible Study that day. On Saturday evenings at 5 whoever is preaching that weekend leads another Bible Study. We also have small groups that meet in homes and other locations, and we're ready and willing to

help you start a group at a time and place convenient for you and your family or friends.

Ever wonder why you're still on the planet? Why God doesn't take people straight to heaven as soon as they come to know the love of Jesus and trust Him for their salvation? Maybe God isn't finished with you yet! Not just in terms of how He plans to use you, but what He plans to teach you about Himself. Maybe you think, “Why bother? Why not just let me go to heaven, and I'll know everything there?” Oops! Know everything? You're not going to become God, you know, and He's the only one who can know everything!

No, God chooses to teach us in this context, in this world of sin and grace, of opportunities and challenges, of joys and sorrows. Think about it. How do we learn best? From experience, right? That means from trial and error, from making mistakes but not repeating them, from being pushed to the edge but not quite going over it! God means for you to learn on earth, and in heaven all we've learned, coupled with the experience of meeting God face to face, will add up to what He wants for us for eternity.

So, don't quit learning! Not even for the summer, not even for a minute! And certainly not because you're an “old dog” and can't learn new tricks! There are beautiful truths about God's great love for us that we haven't caught on to—yet!

because that is how people got to the games. There was no getting away from baseball in New York City in the 50's. Mother, apple pie, and baseball were the basics of life. As I sit down to write to you, the Trinity 8th grade class of 2005 graduate tomorrow night. Just for fun let's compare the lives of these students to the game of baseball.

First of all graduation is know as a commencement exercise. Many of us think of graduation as the end of a period in our lives, but commencement comes from the word "commence" or "begin." So for the sake of comparison graduation is the way our middle school students get to first base and first is high school. Some of students have hit a "rope," a line drive landing in the left outfield. They get to first base easily and actually can turn the corner to second base. Some have hit "Texas leaguer," high pop ups that drop in safely for a hit. Others have gotten to base on four bad pitches. Still others have gotten there because a fielder dropped the ball or they out ran a slow ground ball. One or two may have bounced the ball off the right field wall. No matter how they got there they are on first base and are about to enter high school. Some are in regular programs. Other are in advance programs and still others in special professional career schools called magnets.

The object of baseball is to get on base, but the goal is to advance from base to base until you get home. Our students have made it safely to first, but now comes the hard work of getting to second, third, and home. They have to take risks by leading off the base, distracting the pitcher, and even sometimes stealing second base at an opportune time. They have to be alert and ready to run when the ball is hit, but clever not to get caught off base. Our new high school scholars need to set long and short term goals for themselves so they are ready to advance to the next level and into more advanced programs. Being satisfied with just reaching high school will not help them or the team. They are on first base and have at least three more to go. They need

and take advantage of all the opportunities around them.

Baseball players have teammates, coaches, and fans to help

them along the way. Students have parent, friends, and teachers. Playing for a good team is going to give you a better chance of winning and reaching your goals. Choosing your friends wisely in high school will do the same thing. Players will equip themselves proper with cleats and sliding pads so that they can give their optimum performance. Our students will equip themselves with books, library cards, calculators, etc. so that they can do their best. Athletes train. Students study. Teammates work together and support one another. Students need to do the same especially when they see one of their friends making bad choices.

1. Avoid riding in automobiles because they are responsible for 20% of all fatal accidents.
2. Do not stay home because 17% of all accidents occur in the home.
3. Avoid walking on streets or sidewalks because 14% of all accidents occur to pedestrians.
4. Avoid traveling by air, rail, or water because 16% of all accidents involve these forms of transportation.
5. Of the remaining 33%, 32% of all deaths occur in hospitals. Above all else, avoid hospitals.

You will be pleased to learn that only .001% of all deaths occur in worship services in church, and these are usually related to previous physical disorders. Therefore, logic tells us that the safest place for you to be at any given point in time is at church! Bible study is safe too. The percentage of deaths during Bible study is even less. For safety's sake attend church and read your Bible. It could save your life!

Baseball has rules that are judged by the umpires. You are out or safe, foul or fair, and it is a ball or strike. The rules are clear, black and white. In high school the rules should also be clear, but many students like to think of them as gray. They break rules because they want to be accepted by their peers, because they think that it is fun to break the rules, or because that is the way it's done on TV. Parents, you are the umpires here. You cannot let your game get out of control. Set clear and fair boundaries and enforce them without wavering. Your children will grumble and complain now, but they will thank you for it later.

Finally, the goal in baseball is to get home and help as many teammates get across home plate as possible. In life our goal is to get to heaven and take as many others with us as possible. At Trinity our students have been given all the tools to be successful in this life, and the tools to live forever. Jesus Christ is one of our teammates and he has given heaven and eternal life to us as a gift. In fact, he has already hit the home run that will bring us all home to him heaven. I wish our eight graders well and pray that they will touch all the important bases in life and develop into successful Christian citizens.

Symptoms of a Stroke

The following has been sent to the church from several different caring members. We thought it was something great to share with everyone.

Read and Learn!

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke. Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking **three simple questions:**

1. *Ask the individual to **SMILE**.
2. *Ask him or her to **RAISE BOTH ARMS**.
3. *Ask the person to **SPEAK A SIMPLE SENTENCE**.

If he or she has trouble with any of these tasks, call 9-1-1 immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher. After discovering that a group of non-medical volunteers could identify facial weakness, arm weakness and speech problems, researchers urged the general public to learn the three questions. They presented their conclusions at the American Stroke Association's annual meeting last February. Widespread use of this test could result in prompt diagnosis and treatment of the stroke and prevent brain damage.

Women's Health

Wheat Ridge Ministries Seeding Health and Hope, a monthly Health Ministry Resource for Congregations

Are you aware of the top threats to the health of women in the United States? A recent article published by the Mayo Foundation for Medical Education and Research highlights the following threats-shown in order from most to least common.

Heart Disease—Nearly 489,000 deaths each year.

Cancer—The leading cause of cancer death for women is lung cancer—more than 73,000 women in the US will die from lung cancer in 2005.

Stroke—Nearly 163,000 people in the U.S. die of stroke each year, and almost two-thirds of them are women.

Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease—this covers a group of chronic lung conditions. Its main cause is smoking.

Alzheimer's disease—An estimated 4.5 million American's are affected. Nearly 42,000 women die of Alzheimer's disease each year.

Diabetes—In 2002, diabetes claimed the lives of more than 73,000 people, more than half of them women.

Accidents—More than 37,000 women die from accidents each year, led by motor vehicle accidents and falls.

Pneumonia and influenza—Together, these diseases took the lives of more than 36,000 women in 2002.
