A Blazing Lenten Exchange

March first is Ash Wednesday this year, which means most of you will be reading this just as we're about to start the season of Lent.

After three years here most of you know that I'm in favor of giving something up for Lent—for me, it's always sweets. I do this for three reasons. One, when I think "I'm not going to eat that, it's Lent," it helps me focus on all that Jesus gave up

for me. The chain of thinking goes like this—sweets, giving up, Jesus gave up so much. Because I give up sweets I get lots of reminders to think of His sacrifice. Two, it's good for me. If I could give up sweets for a whole year it would probably be even better! Three, the whole concept of giving something up starts me thinking about adding something to my life, something worthwhile.

I've heard many people say that they don't give up anything for Lent,

they add something. I don't know about your life, but there's no room to add unless I give something up! If I want to eat more healthy foods, I have to give up some less healthy ones, because I already eat enough! If I want to read my Bible more, I need to look at something else (a computer screen, a TV, other books, etc.) less.

Looked at this way, maybe we should simply be talking about an exchange for Lent. What less helpful thing

"Do You Have a Burning Heart?"

"Then their eyes were opened and they recognized him and he disappeared from their sight. They asked each other, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?'" **Luke 24:32-32**

One day following a conversation over lunch with his co-worker, Sam, there was a burning sensation in Bill's heart. Bill's heart wasn't burning from indigestion or the normal heart burn he received after eating a spicy meal. No, instead, it was a burning he had never experienced before.

In his conversation with Sam, Bill learned that Sam was suffering from a broken relationship with a family member. The pain and hurt was overwhelming him so much that it affected everything he did. He couldn't function properly at work and it constantly changed his mood and perception of his other relationships.

For Bill, it was difficult conversation because he didn't know if Sam was a Christian. He didn't want to offend Sam by pushing a viewpoint on him, nor did he want to sound like the stereotypical Christian on the street

corner with a megaphone announcing, "Everyone is going to Hell." However, Bill's heart was still burning.

Bill wasn't a man that grew up in the church, but, since his conversion experience, he has continued to grow in his faith. Bill remembers the time in his life before he knew Jesus as his personal Savior. He was no different than Sam. Today, his heart burns in two ways. First, it is because he knows the Word of God and its saving message. The second is because he wants to share his knowledge of how his relationship with God has been fixed so that others can know that same amazing feeling.

Has your heart ever burned within you? Maybe you see or have seen yourself as either Bill or Sam. The amazing thing we know is that when the disciples heard and were taught about the Scriptures and Jesus' life on the road to Emmaus, their hearts started to burn. That same burning sensation can live in our lives, too. When we surround ourselves with opportunities to learn and grow in God's Word, it teaches us to receive the love of Jesus and then to share it with others. Let your heart burn!

will I exchange for a more helpful thing?

For most Americans, there are two major categories of less helpful things just begging to be given up—overwork, and empty leisure. Some of us have one in our life, some the other, many of us both. Many of us both work too many hours and squander what should be our rest time on “entertainment” that gives no rest.

I don't know what there's too much of in your life, but I'd like to suggest that you take the time this Lent to find something that could be reduced or eliminated in order to make room for something good. Then, after Easter, I have a suggested exchange. Pastor Jon and I will be asking for volunteers to come together March 22 to receive preparation and materials to be hosts and/or leaders for Home Bible Studies that will meet during the 50 days of Easter. We'll all be doing the same study, called “Ablaze,” designed to move us like the disciples on the road to Emmaus. After listening to Jesus and finally recognizing him, they asked, “Did not our hearts burn within us as He spoke to us on the road?”

Along with the other 6,000+ congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, Trinity

hopes to be “Ablaze” with the desire to share what God has done for us in His Son Jesus Christ with 100 million souls by 2017. This Bible Study, done in a number of different homes around the congregation, will help us rediscover the fire of the Gospel and fan the flames.

So I'm asking you to find something that you don't need in your life, begin the discipline of “giving it up,” and prepare your heart for Home Bible Study. (I know that a number of you are already involved in Home Bible Study, and I'm not asking you to give that up for Lent!) I'm also asking that you begin prayerfully considering whether you might be a host and/or a leader (you don't have to be both) for an Ablaze Home Bible Study beginning Easter. If you are so moved, plan to attend a short preparation session at 6:00 pm on March 22—we'll grab a Lenten supper and eat while we prepare before the 7:00 pm worship service that Wednesday.

Please also plan to attend our midweek worship services throughout Lent, beginning with Ash Wednesday on March 1 and continuing for an additional five Wednesdays. Services are at 12:10 pm and 7:00 pm, with a meal at 5:30 pm each week. See you there!

students. We have eight corporate sponsors which will enable us to enlarge the scope of the festival and increase our profit margin.

Our faculty and staff are busy planning for the next school year. More time for reading and language arts will be added to the middle school as well as reducing the size of middle school math, Spanish, and computer classes. With the addition of a full time art teacher both elementary and middle school students will have more art instruction.

We have recently completed a survey of our fourth and fifth grade students to determine eligibility for the Duke Elementary Talent Program. Eight of our nine fourth grade students and eighteen of our fifth grade qualified which is seventy-six percent of our 4th and 5th grade students. We hope that many of our parents will register to participate in this enrichment program.

Again we ask you to recruit and refer students to our school. Many of you have children that have graduated from Trinity and you know the value of a Christ-centered school and a strong academic program.

The critical targets are important. They represent the diverse and rich ministry of Trinity. The congregation will continue to serve all ages of the church because that is part of Trinity's vision. At its February 19th meeting the voters unanimously accepted the critical targets and work done to date by the SP1 . Work now begins on fleshing out these critical targets.

- Develop and integrated five-year “business” plan for worship, contributions, staffing and facilities.
- Integrate planning with the governance process

Visioning Trinity Downtown (Travelodge Project)

Also at the February 19th Voters Meeting, Mr. Ron Roby, Chairman of the Development Committee, reported on the status of this project. The owners of the Travelodge have indicated and initial asking price of approximately 5 million dollars. Trinity's ad hoc appraisal committee has indicated a price of approximately 3.5 to 4 million dollars is more in line with comparable sales in our area. The owners are taking additional time to consider all issues surrounding a potential purchase by Trinity. Trinity will not make an offer to purchase until it has heard back from the owners. This does not mean that our fund-raising efforts should cease. We have raised \$700,000 to date and it is important that we continue the momentum in collecting pledges and seeking additional funds. Meanwhile, the Development Committee continues to look into potential “partnering” opportunities for this project.

You've Got to have a (Healthy) Heart!

The American Heart Association designates February of each year as “Heart Month.” Heart health is so important that it deserves attention every month of the year...even during the month of March! Why? Heart disease continues to be the leading cause of death for both men and women.

Here are some suggestions for keeping your heart healthy, courtesy of our friends at Mayo-Clinic.com:

Don't smoke or use tobacco products The best thing you can do to lower your risk of heart disease is to never start smoking. The second best is to quit if you are already a smoker. Tobacco smoke contains more than 4,800 chemicals, many which can damage your heart and blood vessels.

Keep exercising! Regular moderately vigorous exercise can reduce the risk of heart disease by nearly a quarter. Exercise increases blood flow to the heart, helps control blood pressure,

high cholesterol and diabetes.

Eat a heart-healthy diet Think (and eat) fruits, veggies, whole grains and low-fat intake of saturated and trans fats. Drink alcohol only in moderation.

Maintain a healthy weight Keep an eye on your BMI (body mass index). A BMI good measure is waist circumference. Generally, men with waist measurements great than 40 inches and women greater than 35 inches are overweight.

Get regular health screenings Adults should have blood pressure checked at least every two years and cholesterol at least once every five years. Of course, if you numbers aren't optimal or you have other risk factors, these things should be checked more frequently.

As you continue to live well in the Lord, celebrate the miracle of the human heart by taking good care of it!
