Pastor's Page

"I'm Going to Church?!"

We say that, but what do we mean? I'm not going to bore you with some sort of English lesson. I want to get at the heart of this thing we call "going to church."

Here's what I believe should be wrapped up in the phrase: "I'm going to get together with my fellow believers in Christ to do what the Body of Christ does." So it might mean, "I'm going to a worship service in the sanctuary at 123 East Livingston," or, "I'm headed to the Ministry Center on Magnolia to a meeting of the Board I serve on," or, "I'm stopping by the church office to talk to Pastor about something that's troubling me," or any number of different things.

The reason I want to think this through with you is because "going to church" might only

mean, for you, "I'm going to drive to the corner of Livingston and Ruth, park my car, enter the front door of the sanctuary, pick up a service folder, participate in a worship service, listen to a sermon, put some money in the offering plate, take Communion, shake Pastor's hand, walk out the door, get in my car, and drive home." For a large percentage of the 500 people who attend Trinity on an average weekend, that's the only thing "going to church" ever means.

Don't get me wrong, I certainly want you to do all that! But if that's all you do, there's really something missing. Let me see if I can illustrate what I mean.

When our children were young, I was the pastor of Timothy Lutheran in Woodstock, Georgia. Lisa taught pre-school

while Josh was in another class in our pre-school, and Anna was in first grade. Our life seemed so busy that we couldn't think straight, so one day we actually just laid it out on a calendar. First we put down all my responsibilities, the recurring ones, then, in another color, Lisa's, plus we layered in the children's school schedules. What we were looking for were blank spaces where we all could be together and have some quality time with each other. What we found was that this almost never happened except the hours between when I came home after a meeting or counseling at church, undressed in the dark, and crawled into bed. By the time the alarm went off the next morning, some or all of us were due somewhere else, apart from each other, very soon.

School News

Our faculty and staff reported back to school on July 31. A number of meetings and training sessions were held during the preschool period as well as time preparing for Open House and the first day of school. One of the important sessions was led by Pastor Jon to enable the school to work closer with the church youth leaders and help us to encourage all of our school families to grow spiritually. Other highlights included training in our new math program and using technology in the classroom.

Our curriculum goals for the new school year are:

1. to continue to offer meaningful religious instruction in all grades.
2. to implement new math materials PK-8.
3. to extend Open Court Reading to Grade 5 and emphasize reading strategies and skills at all grade levels.
4. to have a greater focus on writing instruction and to administer writing tests in Grades 3-8.

5. To increase instructional time for reading, English, and mathematics.
6. to provide intervention strategies for students scoring below 40th percentile in reading on the Stanford Achievement Test.
7. to implement health classes in the middle school.
8. to employ an art teacher to provide students with a comprehensive art program.
9. to expand the number of reading tests for our independent reading program. (AR)
10. to implement counseling services for teachers, students, and parents.

Our administrative goals for 2006-07 are:

1. to increase communication flow to and from faculty and parents.
2. to establish a school improvement plan and faculty handbook.
3. to increase teacher training in math, reading and technology.

Visioning Trinity Downtown - Update

“For every house is built by someone, but he who built all things is God.”

- Hebrews 3: 4

On Sunday, August 20th, the voters of Trinity gathered to consider a proposal from Church Development Partners (CDP) regarding the next phase of Trinity's acquisition of the Travelodge property. Following is a short history of the Visioning Trinity Downtown project.

* **1956** the owners of the property at the corner of Livingston and Magnolia signed a 50-year lease with Travelodge. The current Travelodge building was constructed. The lease expired March 2006. The Travelodge operators continue to pay for the use of the property to the three Trusts that actually own the property.

* **2005** - A Development Committee was appointed to look at Trinity's future financial and facilities needs. A developer working with Lutheran Towers discussed with the Committee the possibility of co-partnering with Trinity to locate a senior citizen health care complex on the property occupied by the Travelodge and the Daley property (immediately adjacent to the Travelodge). The Committee approached the owners of the Daley Property and the

Trustee-owners of the Travelodge property to ascertain if they had interest in selling the respective properties. Both indicated an interest. (Since that time Mrs. Daley reconsidered and chose not to sell.)

* **November 2005** - Upon learning the Travelodge Trustee-owners were interested in selling the property to Trinity, the Committee brought the information to the voters to ascertain their interest in purchasing the property. With 60+ voters present at the voters meeting, there was overwhelming approval to pursue the opportunity to purchase the property. The Committee began a fund-raising project with the idea that raising a million dollars (20% of the then asking price of five million dollars) would demonstrate how committed the voters were to the project. The Trustee-owners indicated they wanted a quick sale, wanting Trinity to make a decision by December 31, 2005, so the fund-raising effort was put on a “fast track”.

* **January 2006** - A special congregational fund-raising bar-b-que was held resulting in \$700,000 being raised. The Trustee-owners, however, did not move as quickly as they first indicated.

* **March 2006** In an effort to get the Trustee-owners back to the negotiations, the voters authorized an offer of \$3.5 million. This amount was based on

Can you picture your life laid out on a calendar? (If you're like me, it already is for work purposes, but fill in the hours for sleeping, working on the house, whatever you do habitually.) Don't complicate the picture just yet by layering in all the kids soccer games, piano lessons, etc. Just your own personal life. Now, mark the time you spend specifically serving God as a part of the Body of Christ. Color in that hour or so of worship on weekends, plus whatever else would qualify (I'm not looking over your shoulder, just do it honestly). Of the 168 hours in the week, how many are you spending doing the only things that will last beyond the grave? If it really is just that hour of worship on Sunday morning, is that really what you want, what you believe in, what you want to hold in your hands and present to Jesus when you meet him face to face?

I want “going to church” to have a richer meaning for you. I want Trinity to be more than a place, but think of it as a “place” where you can find the best opportunities to work together with your brothers and sisters to do the will of God.

Some of you have sought out service opportunities outside the walls of Trinity that are certainly service to God, and I applaud that. I would never want to restrict your Christian walk to our campus! You might have sought those outside opportunities because Trinity failed to offer them, and I'm sorry for that failure. Pastor Jon and I, along with the leaders of Trinity, have been devoting ourselves to ending this problem. I hope that whenever you are looking for a service opportunity in the future you'll find it already open or opening at Trinity.

Some of you, I fear, have never really found your “place.” Our Stewardship Board has been working with all the other Boards and

groups at Trinity to make it easier for you to find it! On September 16th and 17th we'll be presenting “Main Street TLCS,” a volunteer fair designed to gather all our service opportunities in one fun place.

My Aunt Lila, when Uncle Rex died, settled all her affairs and . . .

Did you think I was going to tell you she withdrew in on herself, shriveled up, and died? Well, NOT!!! She contacted the Southern Baptist Foreign Mission Board and offered to serve in any capacity they needed. She was invited to the annual Missionary Fair, where representatives of all the mission fields gathered to recruit volunteer and career missionaries, and there found the perfect place England for a year, then (at age 75!), Thailand for two more years. She has just returned from there, and is seeking where God will use her next!

That was the inspiration for our volunteer fair. We want you to have a chance to see every way that we work together at Trinity and choose some areas that seem to fit you. Our Boards are planning their work plans for the entire year, and will offer you many specific opportunities for service. You might sign up for something that asks you for four hours once in November, say, or for something you do every other week or both!

What I ask is that you begin praying now that God will show you how to make “going to church” mean more than an hour in a building. I'll see you on Main Street TLCS!!!

How do you think of yourself in terms of your talents and skills? What has God blessed you with to make you shine? Could it be carpentry, or cooking, or public speaking, or working with numbers; or following a map; or singing; or reading; or listening, or organizing; or directing; or listening? Each person is important in building the kingdom of God; no talent is too small. Your level of education, skill, or intellect is not a determining factor in preparing a servant heart.

A Christian worker expects the Lord to inspire and grant success as Nehemiah says in chapter two verse twenty.

Do you see how God planned the construction? The city was rebuilt not by one man's effort through one massive development project, but through the combined efforts of many. Each small section connected to the other providing a completed wall. We are made to glorify our Creator. We are the reflection of God's love. Your service in our church reflects the change in your life because of God's saving grace through Jesus

Christ. The value of your gift of time and talent is not measured by the size or quantity of time and talent, but how it connects with the gift of others. Service to Trinity Lutheran Church and School is an opportunity, not a favor.

A Christian worker does not let discouragement get him/her down. Nehemiah tells us of the jeers, insults, and anger he and the Jews heard and endured. Yet, in chapter four, verse six Nehemiah tells us the wall was completed "for the people had a mind to work". Your faith is not alive without works, but the works only happen because of your faith. The people with Nehemiah began and completed their building project only through faith and confidence in God. James tells us our faith is the reason we choose to serve. Without works, our faith is dead. Without faith, we have no desire to serve. You choose to serve because you are transformed by God's grace through Jesus and your new life compels you to put your faith into action.

research done by the Committee viewing comparable sales in the area. The Trustee-owners flatly declined that offer. The Trustee-owners counter-offered at \$4.5 million. The voters agreed to tender that amount, with certain conditions.

* **July 2006** After much discussion the Trustee-owners agreed to the \$4.5 million offer. On July 17, 2006, the Trustee-owners signed a contract for sale and purchase. There is a 90 days “due diligence” period. Trinity must decide by October 15, 2006 whether to close on the sale. If Trinity decides not to go forward with the sale at that point, its “down payment” of \$56,250 will be refunded.

During the above process Church Development Partners (CDP) from Orange, California was hired to coach us through the process. It prepared a preliminary feasibility study indicating the purchase was viable and that a 12 to 19-story building could be constructed on the site, delivering additional space for Trinity's future ministries. The height/size of the building will depend on City and County zoning/code requirements. It was also determined that Trinity is in no position to borrow more than our current \$2.5 million debt, and that a capital fund drive would not raise sufficient money to cover the purchase price of the land and the development of it. CDP's opinion was that if Trinity controlled the land it could partner with a

developer to build space, cover the cost of the land and receive ministry space without cost to Trinity.

* **August 20, 2006** Trinity voters met to consider a continuing relationship with CDP and move the feasibility studies to the next level. This includes determining Trinity's actual need for space and fine-tuning details of the feasibility project. This all must be completed by October 15, 2006 (closing date of the “due diligence” period). If Trinity determines to move forward with the purchase as of October 15th, the “down payment” is then non-refundable and Trinity has an additional 90 days (December 15, 2006) to close the sale. At that time an additional \$56,250 is payable to the Trustee-owners.

The voters meeting on August 20th was one of prayerful discernment of God's will, seeking the presence of the Holy Spirit. I am pleased to report that the voters voted (68: Yes; 1 Abstention; 19: No) to accept the resolution to continue the relationship with CDP to proceed to the next phase in this project.

Be assured that the God who builds everything was present at the meeting! These are exciting times at Trinity. I urge you to continue to surround this process in prayer as we move forward. **TO HIM IS THE GLORY!**
