We will continue to watch spending throughout the remainder of the budget year and pray that we are able to bring staff to full fruition of a salary increase. Indeed, God has been good to us through our faithful member, Sophie Kline. Our heartfelt thanks to Mrs Kline and her family.

I know, I know, that's probably wishful thinking. But let me keep my illusions! Already as I turn 49 I'm blessed with a wonderful wife, two outstanding children, a beautiful home, and I begin my third year of serving God and His people in an exciting and challenging congregation. If I'm ever going to feel like it's all together, it should be soon!

I also have more aches and pains than ever, a father with Alzheimer's Disease, in-laws who are finally beginning to show the wear-and-tear of their years, the financial challenges of two children in college, etc. What makes me expect this to be a good year, a year of opportunities rather than a year of potential disasters? Simply the fact that, on top of everything else I have, I have my Christian faith, my belief that God will sustain me and my loved ones through every circumstance, and my conviction that the day of my entry into heaven is closer than ever.

Why am I talking so much about me? Well, I'm thinking out loud to encourage you to do the same. Where are you in your life cycle? What great blessings do you possess? What are your unique challenges right now? And how does all this balance out for you? I'd love to talk to you about these questions, and I invite you to schedule some time to talk with me. Trinity Lutheran School will be hosting informational meetings, open houses, and entrance exam opportunities in an effort to promote our school to perspective parents and students. We have found that our best recruiters are the students and adults that are most familiar with our program. So whether you are a family with elementary and middle school age children or a member of Trinity Lutheran Church interested in one of our ministries, here are some facts that you can share with others.

Trinity Lutheran School has served the members of Trinity and the community of downtown Orlando since 1953. The school is fully accredited by the National Lutheran School Accreditation through the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. This accrediting organization is recognized by Florida and many other states. Our Child Development Center (CDC), elementary school and middle school serves children ages six weeks through 8th grade. Our CDC is licensed and meets all state regulations for size and staffing. In our school the target class sizes are as follows: pre-kindergarten and kindergarten: 20 students; grades 1-4: 24 students; and grades 5-8: 26 students. Our current enrollment in all levels is approximately 260 students.

Here are some additional facts about our school:

CURRICULUM

Our school has a strong Christ-centered program that emphasizes the basic skills. In keeping with our mission statement we integrate our faith throughout our lessons. Religion is taught daily in each classroom. Trinity meets or exceeds Florida state standards in all curricular areas. Subjects taught include: mathematics, algebra, spelling, reading, English, social studies, science, art, physical education, computer, Spanish and music. Trinity graduates are well prepared to attend the high school of their choice and usually enroll in advanced programs. We are proud to say that in the past two years, four of our graduates have been named valedictorians of their respective high schools.

EXTENDED CARE

Trinity Lutheran School offers extended care before and after the regular school hours. Before school care is open from 7:30 am to 8:15 am. After school care operates from dismissal until 5:30 pm. Full day care is offered on many non-school days. Trinity offers a full day Summer Care program for children ages 5-11.



SCHOOL UNIFORMS

All Trinity students wear school uniforms. All uniforms are purchased through Sir Walter, Inc.

January Hymn of the Month: **Beautiful Savior**

The origins of this hymn are largely unknown. It appeared in a Lutheran Sunday School book in 1873 and has remained a favorite of both children and adults alike. Also known as “Fairest Lord Jesus,” this hymn emphasizes the beauty and wonder of Christ and proclaims His Kingship over all His creation. Nothing created compares with the Creator. The hymn is simple praise and worship to the Savior. It brings to mind the shining perfection of the transfigured Christ, the Risen Christ, and the Returning Christ.

The hymn also confesses His dual nature—Son of God and Son of Man. As we sing this hymn this month, we rehearse words that the book of Revelation says will be sung around the throne of God in heaven where we will see Him face to face!

LUNCH PROGRAM

Trinity offers a hot lunch program each day. It is prepared by an outside vendor. This is optional for students.

ATHLETICS

Physical education classes are part of the curriculum for all grades. We have an excellent gymnasium facility. Extra-curricular sports involve students in grades 5-8. Students may participate in volleyball, soccer, basketball, track, golf or cheerleading programs.

Care: Stephen Ministers care by listening, supporting and encouraging, praying, being dependable and trustworthy, and maintaining confidentiality in their caregiving.

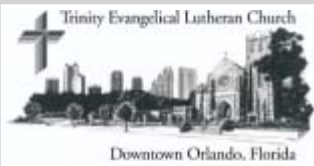
